County honors provincial honors, certificates of achievement and silver spoons were given out. The new club coming up in the new year will be a swing club when the girls will be making a spring outfit.







We extend sympathy to the relatives and family of Mrs. Carrie Scott, who passed away on Sunday at Maple Lodge, RR2 Acton.
