Auxiliary helping hospital grow

The hospital auxiliary voted to donate \$11,000 to equip a two-bed Intensive Care unit now under construction as part of the new wing at Georgetown and District Memorial Hospital. The decision was made last week during the auxiliary's annual meeting held in the hospital's cafeteria. The cheque will be presented to hospital administrator, Alired Morris next month. Mr. Morris praised the members for their interest in

the \$1.25 million dollar expansion project and gave the members a brief look at the new facilities. Auxiliary members found it hard to imagine that the pile of rubble in the main lobby will be their new gift shop in just six weeks time. He gave the ladies a rundown of the new departments and gave them a rough idea where they would be situated.

In her annual report, Mrs. June Deane, president, recalled for the members the success of the various fund-raising activities of the past year: the gift shop; TV service; flower draw; Carnation tag day; bake sale, the auction and the most successful event of the year, the Christmas Ball. She stated that the coming year will offer greater and more rewarding challenges for the auxiliary members in light of the expanded services and 12 new beds added to the existing 70. The new executive was sworn in by Mr. Morris after elections. June Deane will retain her post as president. The slate of officers are as follows: first vice-president, Jean Macdonald; second vice-president, Beulah Lafontaine; third vice-president, Helen Orr; treasurer, Viola Gorth; recording secretary, Donna Jenkins; corresponding secretary, Dorothy Hart; co-ordinator of volunteer services, Sandra Cooper.

Forgetful book worms off the hook

During the week of February 4 to 8, the staff members of the Halton Hills Libraries will turn a blind eye to overdue books. Large boxes located just inside the front doors will enable forgetful borrowers to return their delinquent books with no questions asked and no fines to be paid. Amnesty weeks are used by libraries to underline to their patrons just how important it is to return their books. Few people realize how expensive it is in tax-paid staff time, postage and telephone calls, to pursue lost and overdue books. The nominal fines paid don't begin to cover the costs, nor do they erase the resentment felt by the rest of the community members who would like to use the unavailable material. Many Halton Hills library users are surprised to learn that there is a limit to the fines levied on overdue material. The maximum charges are 75 cents per individual item; \$3.00 for multiple children's items and \$5.00 for multiple adult items. If a patron cannot get to the library to return his books he can return them by mail. Wrap them up well and ask the post office to send them by book rate; it's very inexpensive.


