At a specially called Ontario Hockey Association tribunal held last Thursday night, the Georgetown Raiders were officially suspended from the OHA Intermediate "A" League, for the remainder of this hockey season. This effectively kills any hopes the Raiders had entertained of making another charge at the Hardy Cup.

Juveniles have three of six

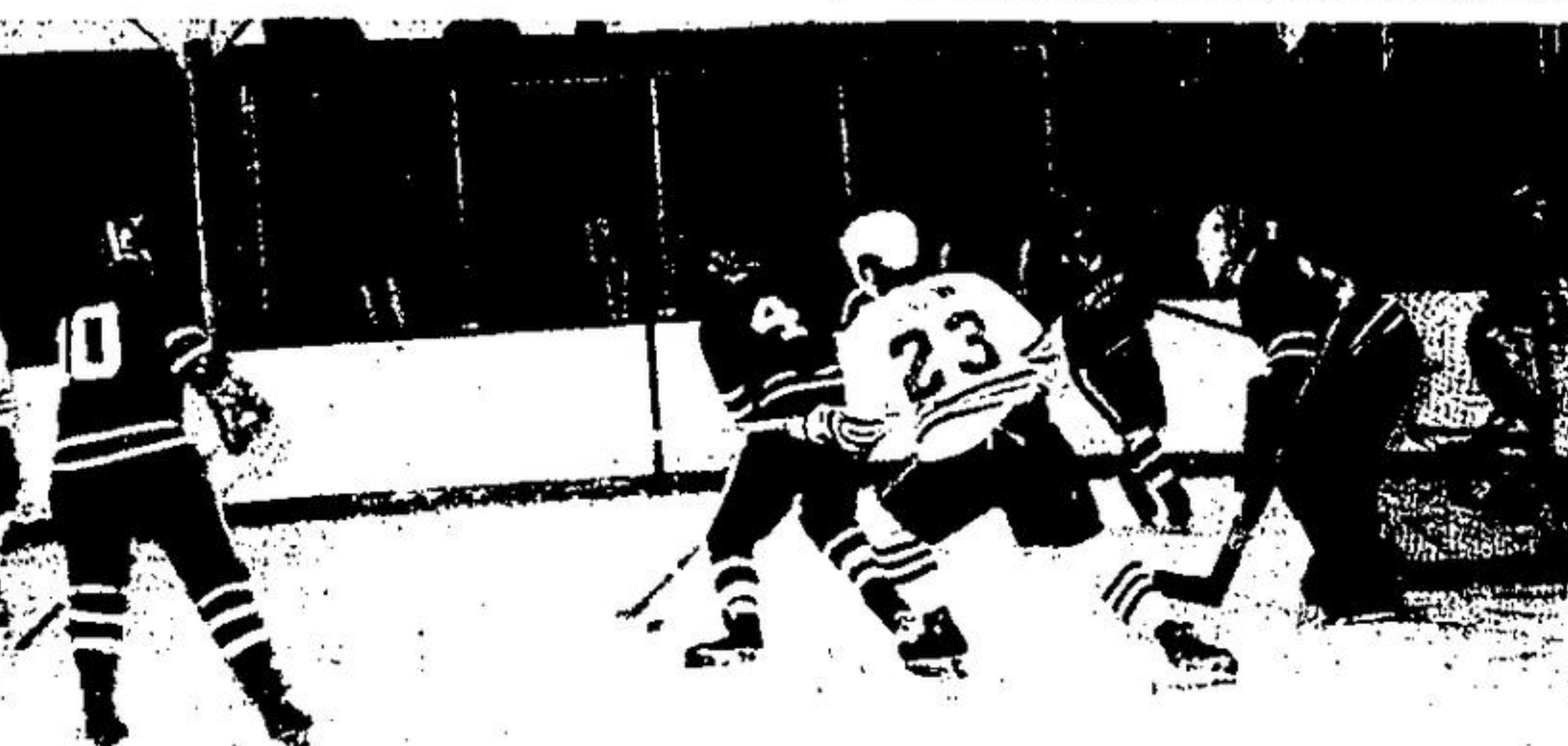
