A very large dead tree complete with its root system was swept down the Credit River and lodged just above the bend in the river above Willow Park in the flood last spring. Norman Guthrie, who was concerned with the possible flooding the tree could cause during this spring's flood, drew the attention of the Credit Valley Conservation Authority to the danger imposed by the tree but no action was taken. During the early flood this year a huge ice jam carried the tree down the river and left it lodged in the middle of the river opposite Willow Park. After many phone calls to various officials by Mr. Guthrie the CVCA finally came and removed the tree.

If this big dead tree had been carried on down the river to the dam it would have completely blocked the flow of water and quite possibly flooded the whole village. Removing the huge tree from the middle of the river was quite an undertaking but has been completed now.


