Other figures revealed in the annual report show the birth rate in Georgetown to be declining in comparison with that of the previous year. There were 299 births recorded for 1974 with 358 for 1973.

If you have a little room in your heart and your home, the program are eleigible for some North Halton Contact Centre financial assistance while would like to hear from you. Since its beginning in 1973, the centre has recognized the need to have homes available for youths who, for valid reasons, cannot live in their

own homes. The program is not intended to be an easy way out for disgruntled teenagers or their parents according to Barbara Johnston, publicity chairman for the Contact Centre.

"We feel that any teen particinating in the program would benefit from a home and family situation," she said. "The routine and responsibilities would be of benefit while efforts are being made for reconciliation."

The centre hopes to have funding available to employ a co-ordinator to administer the

The centre is now seeking participants who could provide a home for teens, 16 years of age and up. Three types of homes are needed: emergency, two to three nights (minimal assessment); semipermanent up to three weeks; and permanent with no limit (up to participant.)
