Trailer owners answer

Are owners of trailers and mobile homes in Halton Hills paying a first class fare only to Residents of the Willow Park trailer park in Norval ap-

proached Councillor Roy Booth recently to question a 50 percent rise in the monthly licensing fees of all trailers in the town. The fee had been \$10 per month but the town has been considering a rise to \$20 per month.

Councillor Booth reported to town council that the trailer owners had questioned not only the amount they were paying but the fact that they had to pay it at all. The owners, he said, pay the municipality for municipal services not only through the licensing fees but through their monthly rents paid to the owner of the park.

Comparing the amount paid by trailer owners on their allocated areas in the park to that paid by a house owner through municipal taxes on a home in Georgetown, Councillor Booth stated, "When you work it out, they pay three-quarters as much in taxes as a home owner does yet they do not get as much out of it."

Councillor Harry Levy pointed out that the \$10 fee was set out in 1956 and had not been changed since.

The bylaw setting out the new \$20 fee was passed by council after the short debate on Councillor Booth's objections.
