Dave Georgetown has signed a three-year contract with the Credit Valley Conservation Authority to handle the food stand in Terra Cotta.

Mr. Kentner's firm was one of two companies to submit tenders but the authority was

unanimous in its approval of the Kentners' application both for financial reasons and past experience with the

Georgetown catering firm. This will be the first year the Kentners have operated the Terra Cotta facility. A Mississauga firm has held the licence for the past three years but didn't

The Kentners have been connected in the past with the

authority through their operation of a mobile food stand in Belfountain last summer and the two winter activity days in Terra Cotta earlier this year.

A major improvement which Mr. Kentner plans for the Terra Cotta stand is an increase in the number of staff who will be on duty to handle the peak periods, lack of which in the past has been a problem for patrons of the park.


