You're going to have to do it yourself

As school draws to an end, the senior students of Georgetown District High School who plan on attending colleges or universities have the added resource this year of the past graduating class to fully prepare them for their next step in education.

"Homesickness is a very common adjustment problem," added Mike Furlong, principal of GDHS. "It appears in many forms." are recommended reading. Learning to become self-motivated is the key to a successful university and college career. Being able to set realistic goals and handle the daily work load

efficiently all contribute to the completion of post-secondary education. A second "Grads Day" will be held next December to prepare future students for continuing education.

Is God alive?

Rev. H. E. Lewis, D.D., Minister, Mountainview Baptist Church
It's a very long Psalm but it's worth reading because it records the kind of question that you may be tempted to ask yourself. Is God really alive and does He care about people? Not a new question,

you'll find it repeated several times in Psalm 76 which records the experiences of the children of Israel as they wandered through the wilderness and thought about God and their own needs; "Can God furnish a table in the wilderness? Can He give bread also. Can He provide for His people?"

true then what use was it for Christ to tell us not to worry about food or clothing because the God who cares for the birds is our Heavenly Father? The best way to be free from worry is to learn to pray about everything that troubles us.

God is concerned about each one of us. So concerned that He sent His son to die on the cross so that through our acceptance of Christ as Saviour, we might know the salvation of God for every problem of life. The apostle Paul assures us that to those who come to Him through Christ, God has promised to "supply all our needs according to His riches in Glory by Christ Jesus."

These are very practical questions for us today. Does God care about rising food costs and inadequate incomes? If He does care, and the Bible affirms that He does, can He do anything to help? We must be clear about our answers to such questions for too many Christians are in danger of drifting into the idea that prayer is a sort of spiritual exercise that has little to do with the practical problems of everyday living.

The teaching of the Lord Jesus is very clear. He taught us to call God our Father and to say "Give us this day our daily bread" when we prayed. This cannot mean anything less than asking God to provide for all our needs. If this isn't

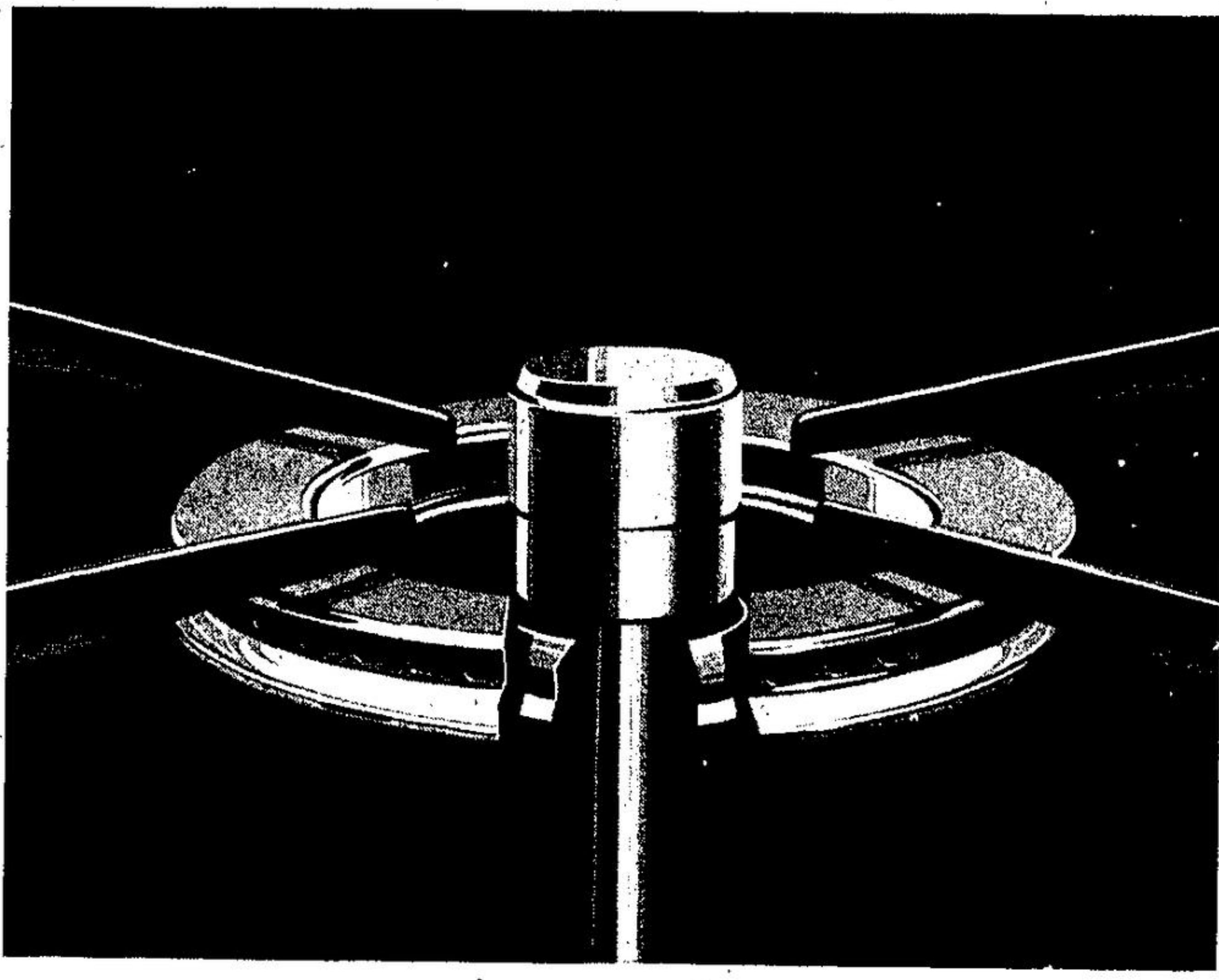
