Hockey support group annual meeting Call for better use of ice time

The Georgetown Minor Hockey Support Group held the annual General Meeting this past Sunday at Cedarvale Community Centre. The approximately 24 people who attended were assured by several members of the executive that this past season could well be regarded as the most successful in the association's history.

As outgoing president Bob Toet remarked, the people involved in the group's various activities did outstanding service and as a result of this, no serious problems arose.

The group showed a bank balance of \$22, however, a guaranteed investment certificate, in the amount of \$5,000 has yet to be called, therefore the financial situation is considered stable.

Various suggestions were tabled in regards to constitutional changes and they will be voted on when the new executive meets, June 1 at 7:00 at Cedarvale.

Head coach, Ron Dixon, brought up the point that roughly 40 percent of practice time is wasted, through various reasons and he suggested that since the association is paying for ice time they should assure that it is used properly. Also in connection with ice time, treasurer Bob Thompson noted that with two ice surfaces in use next year, the association's cost is expected to double from this year's \$7,400 outlay to roughly \$14,000. As he pointed out, the money will have to come from somewhere but this dilemma was left for the new executive's perusal.

One problem that seems to crop up year after year is the continual loss of equipment. One suggestion from the floor was to have parents sign for their youngsters' equipment. The resultant financial responsibility on the parents' part might insure a drop in equipment losses. Again, a decision was left to the new executive.

One amendment was made to the constitution in regards to the number of persons allowed to serve on the association's executive committee. A change was instituted which would allow not less than 15 members to service with the maximum number of persons serving left open.

The one spark of controversy in the meeting came about as a result of an OMHA directive. It stated that all hockey players—regardless of age—registering with the association must have a social insurance number. One gentleman objected strenuously citing two reasons for his objection to the directive. He felt it wrong that the younger players be subjected to a government number system and he also suggested that this was just a sly government ploy to assure that players who go on into Junior hockey will be feeding back taxes to the government for monies earned.

Apparently these reasons were not sufficiently satisfactory as it was urged from the floor that other area groups be contacted to lodge a protest against the OMHA directive.

The new executive of the Georgetown Minor Hockey Support group includes: past-president Bob Toet; president Bob Thompson; first vice-president, Chuck Krajacich; second vice-president, Al Adams; treasurer, Shirley Simpson; and secretary Joyce Iglesias. The head coach for the upcoming season will be appointed at a later date.

This season's executive committee, although not completely filled, includes: Jim Buck, Karen Harrison, Ken South, Henry Cull, Dawn Thompson, Bill Love, Pat

Doucette, Liz Barnes, Ann McMenem, Pete Pomeroy, Bob McCandless, Ron Eckroth and Dave Fotheringham.

Falcons in Toronto league

The Georgetown Falcons will again this year be doing battle in the Toronto and District Soccer League's Division West. The team was first formed to give youngsters too old to play in the Georgetown Minor Soccer Association a chance to continue with their chosen sport. Technically, eligibility for the team is open to those 18 years or older but this year's contingent will be a young team composed mainly of players from last year's Junior "B" crew.

The team has been working out indoors over the winter but held their first outdoor practice last Sunday, and according to team president, Haddy Smedema, looks to be in fine shape. The team will carry 18 players and, to date, 17 members have been selected. Thirty-two players have been attending practices and Mr. Smedema made the point that exhibition games will be arranged for those players not making the team so they will be active in the sport throughout the summer.

The Toronto and District League is considered the largest and possibly the best Senior League in North America. Last year, in the Second Division West, the Falcons finished in eighth place in their league standings, garnering 14 points.

Needless to say the Falcons will be wholeheartedly attempting to improve on that record this year. As yet, no schedules have been finalized, however it is expected that the Falcons will begin their season in the latter part of May and play their first home game in the early part of June.

Rebs track

This past Saturday, the GDHS Rebel's Track and Field team was in action on two fronts. The Midget boys took part in the Westdale Invitational Track and Field Meet at McMaster University in Hamilton, while the Girls and Junior and Senior track teams travelled to Waterloo to participate in the 14th annual Warrior Invitational Track and Field Meet held at Waterloo University.

The Westdale meet attracted teams from all over the province and excellent performances were turned in by several GDHS athletes. Ross Jeffrey won his heat in the hurdles event and placed second in his 100-metre dash. Ross also finished third overall in the 400-metre dash and his time of 53.7 was just two-tenths of a second off the winning time. Art Wheeler finished fourth in out of 34 competitors in the javelin.

Jennie Thompson won her heat in the 1500 metre event and finished seventh overall in a field of 36. In the same event, Cathy Clark came up with a superb effort to finish third in her heat and a similar third overall. Cathy Masson finished second in her 100 metre event and qualified to run in the semi-final.
