MANAGED FOREST TAX REDUCTION PROGRAM

The Ontario Government has set up a program of tax reductions on forest land. The purpose is to encourage proper management of such land, and to ensure its fullest productivity.

Qualifying forest land owners will receive grants equal to 50% of the 1973-74-75 municipal and school taxes levied on their forest property.

This program will be of interest to anyone owning forest land that is not assessed as part of a farm. It is for the relief of landowners who manage their forests for the production of wood and wood products, and for the provision of wildlife habitat, water conservation, and prevention of erosion.
