## Moore Park Tennis Association gets go-ahead

# Council approves club rules

Until the recreation department and town council have reviewed the operations of the three neighborhood tennis clubs in Halton Hills, the clubs including the newly formed Moore Park Tennis Association will operate as they have been in the past. Each club will designate when the general public may play on its courts. However any person who is genuinely interested in playing tennis can join any of the clubs.

Over the objections of Councillor Ern Hyde town council last Tuesday night approved the constitution of the Moore Park club, reversing a decision they made the night before. The method by which the various tennis clubs operate, however, will be reviewed by council's general administration committee this summer with the view of possibly providing more town council over the clubs' activities.

Councillor Len Cox summed up several councillors change in thinking. "I have changed my tune in thinking that probably, by having a group or organization there may be more utilization made of this. It seems that a very few people seem to take over."

Voicing his strong objection to council supporting the constitution Councillor Hyde said, "This whole matter should be studied by council in consultation with our recreation department. We have the people-program co-ordinators—who are the ones who should be saying who can use these facilities."

## Morris resigns

"Georgetown is not losing an engineer, but gaining another complaining citizen," said Peter Morris, jokingly. Mr. Morris announced his resignation as town engineer last week in a letter to town council.

Mr. Morris has been with the town of Halton Hills for two years. Prior to that he was with the Borough of Scarborough and the Town of Dundas. "One thing that made being works engineer a lot easier was the co-operation with the works committee," explained Mr. Morris. "The relationship was good."

Mr. Morris noted, the first year of regionalization was difficult as the channels of communication had to develop, boundaries had to be established and duties outlined before the job of caring for Georgetown, Acton and Esqueping could begin.

All construction projects plus regular maintenance of the roads, and parks fall within the realm of the Halton Hills Works Department, and is under direct control of the engineer.

Mr. Morris' resignation will become effective June 30 when he begins his new job as land development engineer for Wimpey Homes of Toronto.

Several projects which Mr. Morris has worked hard to see completed will just be beginning as he leaves. Complete re-

construction of Raylawn Crescent was scheduled to begin Monday. Sargent Road construction is slated for July and storm sewers are to be added to Normandy and a section of Rexway Drive later this summer. The addition of the Gordon Alcott Memorial Arena will give one added project to the engineer and his crew. In order to accommodate the increased traffic flow it will be necessary to widen Guelph Street at the arena entrance.

A further responsibility has been added to the works department, that of the recreation maintenance budget to cover upkeep of the parks and other facilities under the recreation department.

Regular maintenance of these facilities has been the responsibility of the works department, even under the old town system, with a specific amount of the recreation budget allocated for maintenance.

"By knowing what the budget is we can more closely administer the work that must be done," added Mr. Morris. "We have the equipment and personnel for the job and want to see them done properly."

There are 55 town employees in the works department. Mr. Morris will remain in town with his wife Karen, and their 7-month-old daughter, Tanya, in their Wilson Court home.

Costs of the work will be paid for by the builder requiring the sewer, Al Pitutti.

control the traffic. Yet I don't believe they accept any responsibility. The legal liability still rests with us. "This is completely wrong. Until this matter is resolved our works department should install sewer laterals and we should not leave this to private contractors." Noting that the town's wish to retain control of sewer and water line installations has already been turned down once by the region Councillor Hyde continued that the provincial government has indicated that

it might favour Halton Hills' stand in the near future. Councillor Len Cox, a member of the region's work committee, explained that the region's decision to allow private contractors to carry out sewer connections had not been approved by the works committee. "This must have been made at a staff level." "Of all the stupid pieces of policy to come from the region it is certainly further proof of where the responsibility for water and sewage should rest."

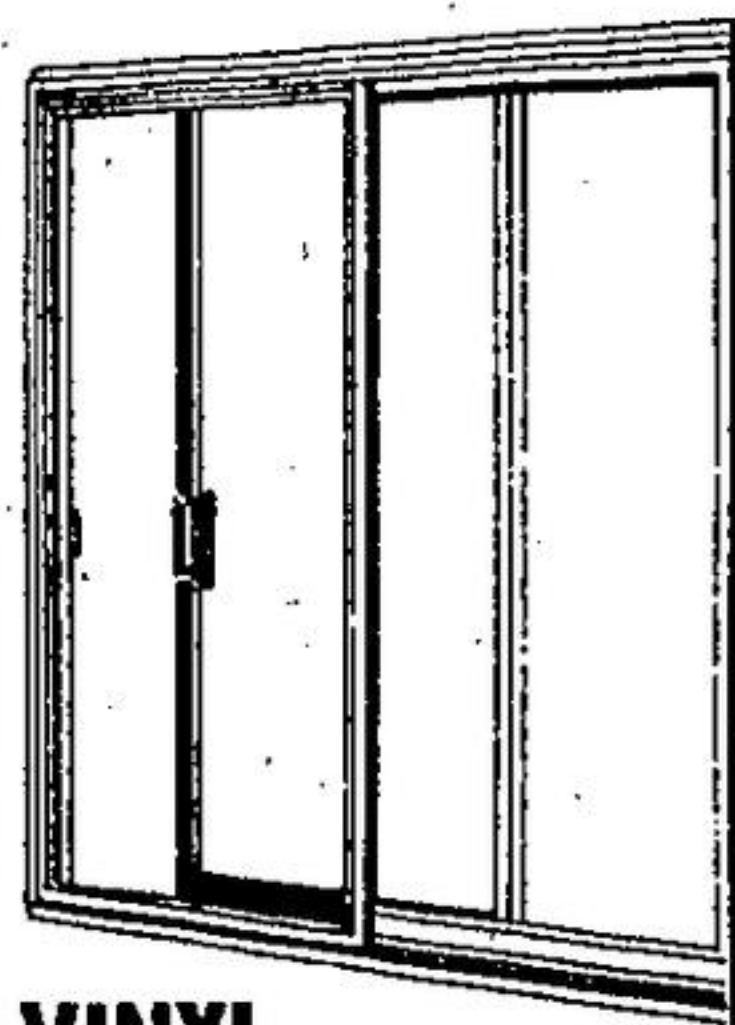

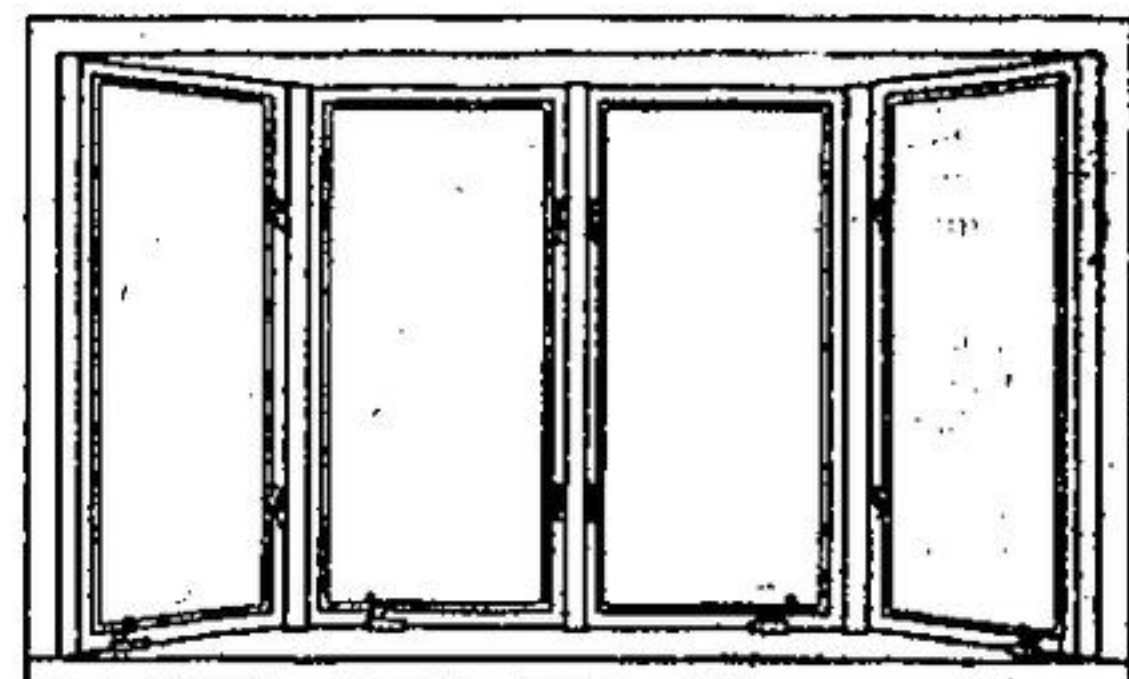
