Tykes bump Burlington

The Georgetown Tykes of the HCBA, having moved into third spot in the league standings behind Burlington and Brampton as a result of three winning performances in their last four outings.

On June 13 the Tykes abelacked Waterdown 29-11. On June 16, the Georgetown nine again showed no mercy for Waterdown as they dropped them 7-3. Their lone loss in the last four games was to Brampton 12-11 but they were quickly back on the

winning road as they dumped Oakville 15-7 in Georgetown on Monday night.

In Monday night's contest Duane Hatcher was credited with the win, getting relief help from Dave McGuire who pitched a fine two innings, chalked up four, third-strike decisions. Dave Norton was a thorn in Oakville's side all night as he went three-for-three, walked twice and scored five times.

Duane Hatcher, in addition to his pitching effort, was two-for-five at the plate and

knocked in three runs. Scott Pentecost scored three times and Dave Doucette picked up two RBIs.

Last weekend the Tykes journeyed to Guelph for the Kinsmen Tyke Tournament here but were eliminated after they dropped their second game 3-2 to Hamilton. They made their tournament debut a smashing success when they defeated Guelph 9-4.

In the Guelph game, Dave McGuire picked up the win and Mike Doucette hit two for two including three runs batted in.

The heartbreaking loss to Hamilton took nothing away from the Tyke's performance as the team played extremely well. The score was tied 1-1 as late as the fourth inning but Hamilton picked up two runs in their half of the fifth while Georgetown could only add a single marker and went down to defeat.

Duane Hatcher was tagged with the loss but pitched a fine game. Hatcher also looked good at the plate as did Bobby Marks, David Doucette and Scott Pentecost.

OHA approves town Jr. 'B' team

It's now official, a Junior "B" team will be operating in Georgetown for this coming season. Dave Branch, an OHA secretary, confirmed with this paper on Monday that Georgetown had been accepted into the OHA Junior "B" fold.

The Georgetown entry will be competing in OHA Group 7 along with teams from Burlington, Oakville, Brampton, Milton, Streetville and Dixie. The members of this league are due to meet sometime in the near future to set up the league's schedule and the format for playoffs. According to the OHA, the only stipulation that they will make is that a group winner be decided on by March 14 in order to advance into playdowns.

The Georgetown Junior "B" coach Paul Robinson expects the league to be very competitive, with a high calibre of hockey on display for the hockey buffs' entertainment. In backing up his point, Robinson noted that

Oakville advanced all the way to the All-Ontario Jr. "B" finals last year and would probably provide the league's stiffest opposition.

Although no players have been inked as yet, Robinson indicated that the club has been in touch with several prospects but contended that it was too early as yet to expect definite commitments.

The Georgetown Junior "B's" will open training camp August 20th and it is expected that about 50 hopefuls will attend. All the players who attend camp will be there by invitation only and the battles for places on the club are expected to provide great spectator interest. Robinson feels that, even though his club is a first year entry, it can and will be competitive. There will be no break once the training camp gets under way and exhibition games are already being lined up which will lead the team directly into the

regular schedule.

In order to get the team into fighting trim the exhibition schedule is being worked into bringing higher bracketed teams to town and one team that is expected to do pre-season battle is the Toronto Marlies. As yet there has been no official word from team management regarding pre-season competitors, but a game against a Junior "A" team has been set up for Sunday, September 14.

A solid foundation for Georgetown's newest hockey endeavour is currently being laid by the team executive and it's obvious from the plans currently being formulated that the team has a bright future. Town support is however a prerequisite for a successful team and anyone wishing to help out, in whatever manner, should contact a member of the executive who will be able to provide further information regarding team requirements.

floor shortly. Anyone walking into the Georgetown arena after one period of play on Thursday night would have been excused if he thought the score board was malfunctioning. At that point in the game the Rams were clinging to a 1-0 lead in a defensively dominated game.

The second period broke the spell however as the Rams counted seven times to Owen Sound's three to take a comfortable four-goal lead into the last 20 minutes. The final period again featured defensive play but the Rams struck for four goals to Owen Sound's three to walk off the floor, 12-6 victors. The game was something of a rough affair, with the Rams picking up 32 minutes in penalties to Owen Sound's 58 minutes but in all fairness to the players, questionable calls by the referees led to a lot of the chippiness.

The Rams' goals were split amongst ten players. Bruce Cooksley and Steve Wilson each had a pair of counters, while singles went to Ron Turkoz, Kent Kentner, Jim Chislow, Ian Campbell, Glen

Sherman, Andy Broadbent, Bruce Green and Bill Fox.

Rams' management now feel that the team is finally coming into its own and starting to play up to their potential. Unfortunately the crowds viewing the games at the Georgetown arena continue to be sparse and disappointing. The Rams' record now stands at four wins and eight losses but their play of late has improved to the point that they do deserve better local backing.

Lacrosse may be a somewhat strange game to most Georgetown sports fans but it is an exciting, fast-paced game and the Rams alternately employ finesse and physical confrontation to provide highly spiced sports entertainment.

The Ram's next home encounter is Monday, June 30 when they will host Orangeville and it should prove to be a very lively contest. Orangeville will be out to avenge their recent loss to the Rams, while the Halton Hills squad will be out to prove that they have turned the

corner towards a successful season. Fan support can give a team an edge and the Rams are hoping to attract considerably more boosters in their games to come.
