

No more penalties or defensive lapses for Rams

Although the Halton Hills Rams lacrosse team split their two games this past week—losing 13-12 to Huntsville in Huntsville on Thursday night and beating Orangeville Stingers 12-9 at home on Monday night—their play is continuing to improve and this can only auger well for their chances of a high finish in the league's standings. Defensive lapses had plagued the team in the early part of the season as well as a tendency to take foolish penalties under pressure in close games. Both these trends seem to have been stemmed and the Rams are a

much better team because of the change. Huntsville continues to plague the Rams but on Thursday the game could easily have gone either way and the one goal margin for Huntsville's win is indicative of the closeness of the contest. The only period in which Huntsville had the advantage was the opening one, when they outscored the Rams 5-4. From this point on it was a stalemate as both teams matched goals for the final 40 minutes. The score was 9-8 at end of two periods and, although the Rams were

pressing in the latter stages of the game, their efforts fell short and Huntsville escaped with their narrow victory. At home against second place Orangeville Stingers on Monday night, it appeared that the Rams were really getting their game together. Although they did not play their best game of the year, the Rams executed all aspects of the game well enough to gain two points. The offence came through with just enough fire-power. Gary Turkoz played a strong, sometimes spectacular game in nets and the defense proved just as tough as they had to be when Orangeville applied pressure. This was especially true in the dying minutes of the game, when Orangeville were rallying; scoring three times in the final ten minutes. As was the case throughout the game, however, when a goal was needed in a tight situation the Rams came through and George Artem put Orangeville on the ropes with the Rams' final goal with 1:24 left to go. Wayne Young played a fine game for the Rams and,

although he did not score a goal, his constant defensive harassing and rushes the length of the floor continually kept the Stingers off balance. Intimidation is part of the game and a lot of credit for the Rams' win should go to Kent Kenner who made his presence felt at both ends of the floor. At times it appeared that the Huntsville players were listening for the husky Kenner's footsteps. He was also quick to strike back at any Stinger foolish enough to attempt to rough ride and this had a bearing on the final outcome. Ron Turkoz hit for three

Ram goals, as did Bruce Cooksley. George Artem who put the final damper on Huntsville had a two-goal evening, while singles went to Tim Chisholm, Steve Wilson, Paul Wilson and Georgetown's Andy Broadbent. Paul Wilson returned to action last night after being injured in the face in a contest last week. He put in a solid game, adding an assist to his single counter. The Rams travel to Owen Sound this Thursday, then get a bit of a breather before their next home game, Tuesday, July 10 against Orillia.

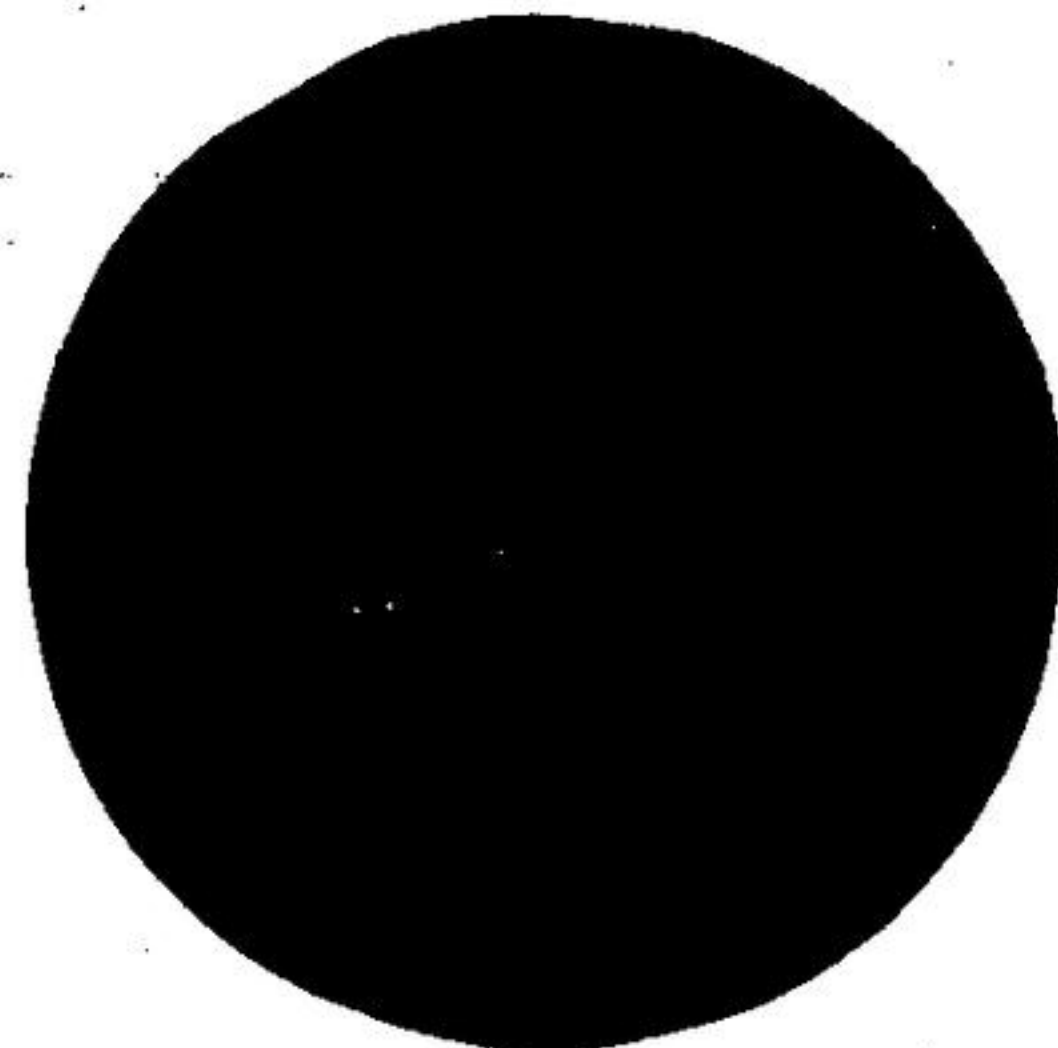
