Obituary: Joseph Hall

Joseph Hall Sr., a well-known and active resident of Georgetown for many years, passed away June 18 in his 91st year. He was in the Excellence Nursing Home in Mississauga where he had been confined since taking a stroke in October of 1971. Mr. Hall was born in the small village of Langtoft in Lincolnshire, England on August 7, 1884. He spent his early years there until he came to Canada in 1912. When war was declared he joined the Canadian Army and served in France. After the war he returned and was discharged in Toronto. From there he moved to Georgetown with his family in 1919. He had been an active resident of this town ever since.

He was a member of the Georgetown Volunteer Fire Department for many years as well as a member of town council for one term. He was very active for a number of years in the Independent Order of Oddfellows and was on the building committee when the Georgetown Memorial Arena and Oddfellows Hall was built.

Mr. Hall was a past member of the Verdun Rebekah Lodge and a past County Master of the Orange Lodge of Halton County. He was also a member and past Master of LOL 245 Georgetown and a member of the Loyal True Blue Association.

At the time of his retirement in 1954 he was employed at Smith and Stone as a stationary engineer. Mr. Hall was predeceased by his wife, Ada Brown in 1948, his parents and sisters, Polly, Emma and Clara, and brothers, Jack and George. He leaves his sons John, of Hamilton, Joe of Georgetown, Bob of St. Catharines, daughters Ethel, Mrs. C. Boyd of Erin, Irene, Mrs. F. Mathers of Callander, Ann, Mrs. R. Riddall of Georgetown and a brother, Mark of Langtoft, England.

Mr. Hall also leaves 17 grandchildren and 27 great grandchildren.
