Dump Armourdale in second round Major Atoms stay on championship ladder

Second round play in the Ontario Cup, Major Atom division, got underway last week as Georgetown travelled to Armourdale - a suburb of Toronto - in an attempt to keep their championship hopes alive. They did just that, coming off the pitch with a convincing 2-1 lead and the right to advance into the third round.

Georgetown went on the offensive right from the opening whistle. Time and again they were in the Armourdale penalty area, harassing the goaler, but just couldn't seem to finish off their plays. Armourdale began to show signs of willing under the pressure and it was obvious that it was only a question of time until Georgetown scored.

Georgetown took the lead on what could only be described as a team effort. Rose started the play up to Mark Waters. Waters sent the ball to Oram at right wing and on the return pass, Waters made no mistake with his shot and sent it winging past the Armourdale goaler.

The opening goal of the game spurred Georgetown on even more and they had scoring chances galore. Unfortunately, over-anxious play resulted in many missed opportunities but there was no question that the local lads were in complete control of the contest. In fact, Armourdale did not get the ball out of their half until over 25 minutes of play had gone by.

Mark Waters picked up his second goal of the game to give Georgetown a 2-0 lead and, again, a pretty passing combination made the counter possible. The ball was moved up by the halfbacks to inside left Rose. He sent a nice pass over to Oram at right wing who worked his way up the side

before centring for Mark Waters to boot home. Rose, Clark and Sweezy displayed excellent passing in the first half but were frustrated when the finishing touch was needed. Armourdale got their lone tally of the game with just minutes left in the half. It was one of the few Armourdale forays into the Georgetown end and perhaps inaction made the Georgetown goaler react slower as he was out of position when the goal was scored. The teams left the pitch at half-time with Georgetown leading 2-1. As it turned out, there would be no scoring in the second half as Armourdale played better soccer and the Georgetown

lads seemed content with their one goal lead. With 13 minutes left in the contest, however, Georgetown realized the potential danger of their defensive shell and once again took command. Howie Oram got the locals back in the thick of things and his constant rushes left Armourdale defenders breathless in his wake. With five minutes left in the game Georgetown was awarded a penalty shot but, as had happened on numerous previous scoring chances, the ball went wide of the mark.

The two stars of the game for Georgetown were Mark Waters, for his two goals, and Howie Oram, for his hustling, heads-up play.
