chairman of the water committee of the Norval Community Association, reports that Jack Corbett, Director of Public Works for the regional government reported to her Proctor and Redfern firm. that they are doing all they can to get water for Norval as soon as possible but It is unlikely that the work can be started this year.

At present they are waiting for a detailed report from the firm of Proctor and Redfern on the actual cost of the project and the cost to each home owner. When they receive this report, which they expect in about five or six weeks, they will have a meeting with the residents of the village to present them with all the facts.

At present the project is in the '78 budget but Mr. Corbett reports that they are trying to get it into the '75 budget. If they are successful then they can start calling for tenders for the work in hopes that they will be able to start early next

He also reported that the water 'tower referred to in other reports as necessary is not vital and may not have to be built. This would mean a substantial saving somewhere between \$80,000






