Diane Baginski and Cindy McGilloway won the Gold medal in the Novice Ladies Similar Pairs and provided a secondary story to their achievement. The girls professionals, the former misses Donna and Lynda Taylor won the Trophy back in 1963, so the Acton youngsters brought the story full circle. Cindy also was fifth in her flight in the Ladies Bronze Interpretive, and second in her flight in the Pre-Novice Ladies "A" category. Diane was fifth in her flight in the Pre-Novice Ladies category.
