"We have received many complaints about people practising golf in the cemetery in Acton. Is there any way we can include it?" questioned Councillor Duby.

"It would be a deadly place to play golf," commented Councillor Roy Booth.

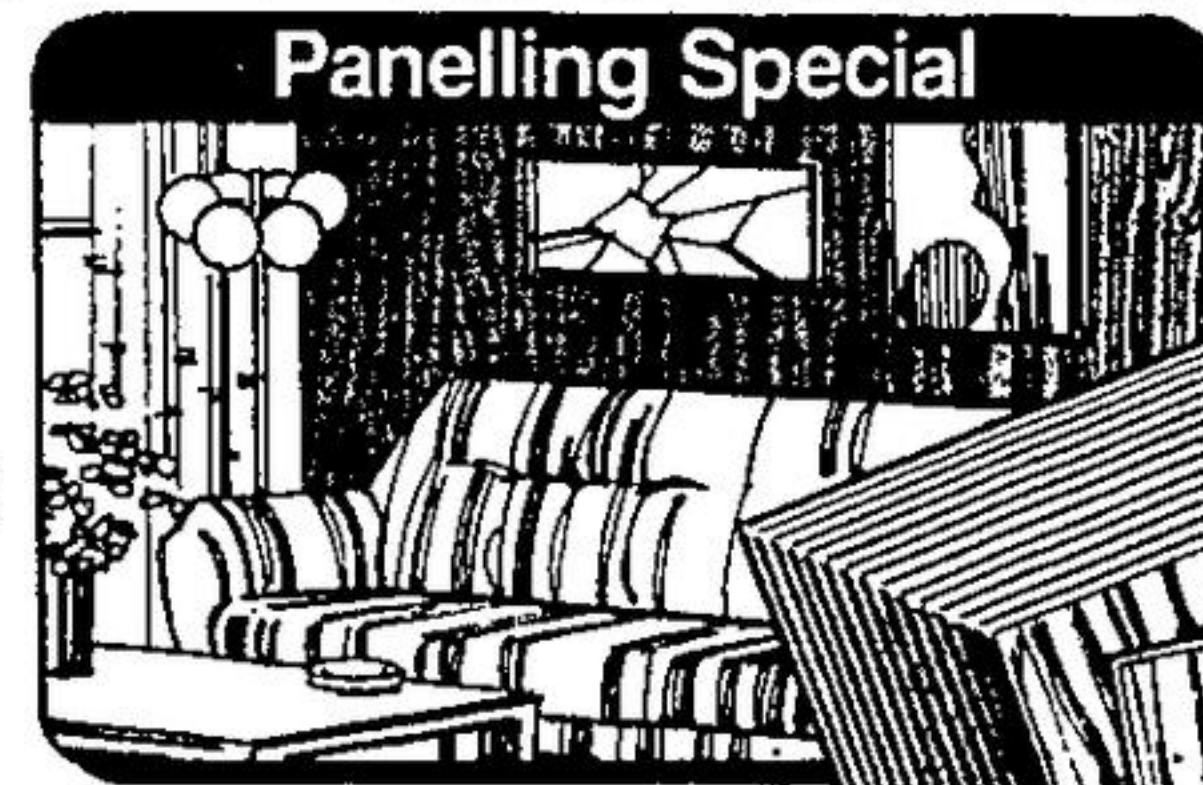

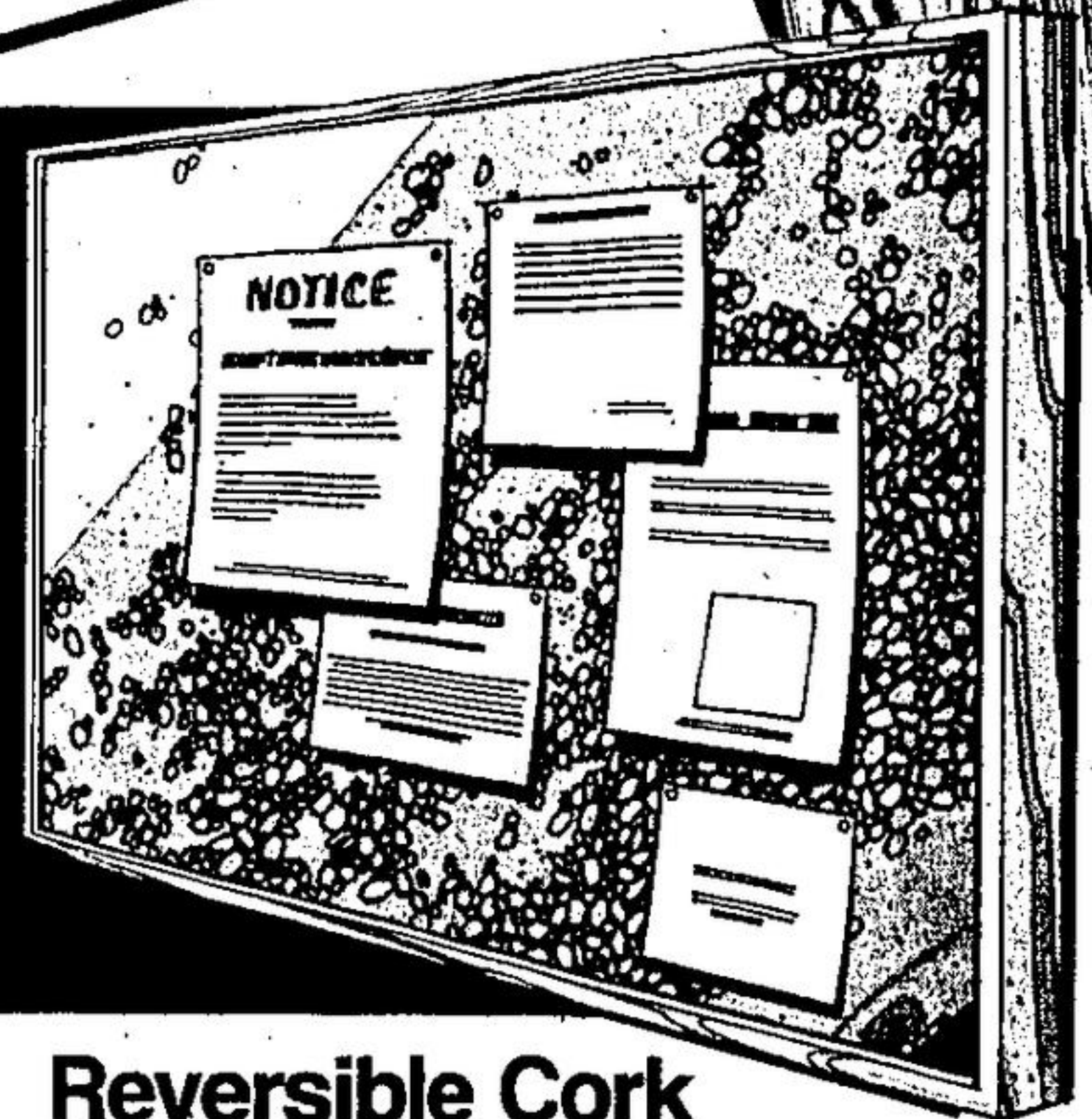
