# Ontario Outdoors \$500 prize in Coho Derby

**PORT DALHOUSIE**—A 4-5 foot tug is being built here with the specific intention of fishing for the Chinook Salmon that have been planted in the lake. Sport fishermen are up in arms about it and no one can blame them. Is it always the commercial fisherman that is catered to? The Coho Salmon in the Great Lakes were stocked mainly with commercial fishing in mind.

**GEORGETOWN**—Cooler weather brings excellent fishing as Bass go on a feeding spree. Trout are starting to get back into the swing of things, and good catches can be made.

**PORT CREDIT**—The Salmon are running again, and with them are numerous Rainbow Trout, some Chinook Salmon, and the occasional Brown Trout. The dominant species, of course, is the well known and often touted Coho Salmon. These fish can be caught off the docks and piers along the best method by far is to go out into the lake at the mouth of the river and troll for them. The Garcia Tadpole lure is one of the hottest things to come along on the salmon scene.

**STREETSVILLE**—Some problems are expected here as a few residents resist all efforts to remove the dam that is blockage to the upstream migration of the Salmon. Crowds of fishermen are expected to descend on the area in the hopes of hooking one of these wonder fish.

**GEORGETOWN**—Just to get you back home for a while. Don't forget, if you are going after one of these Salmon, there is a Coho Derby with a cash prize of \$500 and three other cash prizes. This is operated on the Credit River with the official weigh station on the bank of the river between the railway bridge and Hwy. 2. Entry fee is \$2 and can be obtained in several areas. There are also 11 merchandise prizes for those fish not taking the top four prizes.

**PLEASE REMEMBER:** Do not trespass, do not snag fish, do not damage other person's property. These have caused troubles in the past and could mean a complete stoppage of fishing on the Credit River as can be seen by the closure of specific areas already this year. I would hate to see some SOB spoil it for the rest of us by not being respectful of other people's property and the fishing laws.

There is a limit on Salmon: five in one day of any species other than Atlantic and these five are counted if one species or mixed. In other words you may have three Coho, two Chinook and one Kokanee and they are all included in your limit of five fish.

Encourage others to stay within the bounds of the laws and common sense and we all will enjoy ONTARIO OUTDOORS.
