Remove dam?

A report recently stated that the silt up river would all be washed down river when the dam is removed. Does one think that the silt could be removed as it is good top soil?

Is the dam "Scenic" as is often stated? And how about it being a landmark? Committee chairman Gordon Brown stated that "the present ponding is more attractive" and proposed "the building of fish ladders."

The pond on the west bank is a stagnant pool and has been that way for years. It is of no use and has no function. As for fish ladders they do not work. And that's a fact!

Historical? Maybe but of sentimental value? Who can get sentimental about a broken-up piece of concrete? According to a telephone conversation I had with the engineer at the Credit Valley Conservation Authority office, a study will be implemented in 1978 and this may take a year. After this the study will have to be examined and then implemented.

This could take a total of three years or more before the dam could be removed. The McCarthy Mill dam in Streetville is already breached and will be removed as soon as all details are cleared, as I mentioned last week. However, there are two other dams in that area that I failed to mention, and some folks were asking me about. These will have to be studied and that probably will take a lot of discussion and maybe legal action.



It was nice to meet so many outdoors minded people at the Georgetown Fall Fair last Saturday. Of course I did not spend the whole day there, what with so many outdoor opportunities available at this time of year.

With the hunting season just underway the new book by DBI Books Inc. formerly Digest Books Inc. is truly timely. This one, the all new Gun Digest is about the largest book they have published to date. This is their 30th anniversary issue so I think that speaks for the popularity and the quality of these fine books. The 1976 edition is celebrating the 25th year of John T. Amber as its editor.

Did you ever consider the hunters knife? Gun Digest has an extremely interesting section on some of the world's finest knifemakers. An all round excellent book, timely, current and well put together: Gun Digest 1976.

Small Mouth and Large Mouth Black Bass are open to November 30. I latched on to six Large Mouths on Saturday (Oct. 4) and the season is still good with the Bass in a feeding frenzy. These favoured fish are putting on a layer of fat for the winter right now, and are willing strikers, especially in late afternoon. My only mistake was going in the early morning, but sometimes you have to take it when you can get it.

When the sun warms the water in the fall the Bass will often jump right out of the water to feed on most anything that catches its eye. I had plenty of strikes on a plastic worm rig but I did not have a trailing hook and missed most of them.

A man with dew worms or crawfish will clean up and a Mepps Comet, the one with the plastic minnow, is a real favourite at this time of year. If you know how to fish for Walleyes with a lead head jig, then try it on the Black Bases in the fall.

Of course the Salmon are still on the scene with more Chinooks showing up as the season progresses. The Rainbow are in the Saugeen at Southampton for those of you who like to travel and have the time; or the Sydenham at Owen Sound. Real fine fish are being taken out of the Nottawasaga river at Wasaga Beach, and don't forget the Shale-Shelf-Shore at Craigleith. Some really fine catches are made here, although it is a specialized form of fishing.

If you see someone (they won't be sportsmen) snagging fish-report them. I would report one of my friends if I saw him intentionally snagging fish, although none of my friends would.

We must clear our name! Sportsmen don't need that kind of publicity, can you imagine a dedicated angler with three sharp pieces of steel welded into a treble hook arrangement on a length of sash cord?

This is market hunting! Let's keep fishing clean in ONTARIO OUTDOORS.
