

We bear a poppy, in remembrance. We place a wreath, in remembrance. We bow our heads in silent prayer, in remembrance. And we remember the solemn words written by John McCrae in the poem, "In Flanders Fields".

Yet what does November 11, Remembrance Day, really mean and symbolize in the hearts of the many who never witnessed nor suffered the cruelties of war?

We asked five Grade 3 students of George Kennedy Public School what they felt was the meaning behind Remembrance Day and what their feelings were towards the one day dedicated to the fallen heroes of the war.

Keryl Bell, 16 Rosefield Dr.: "Remembrance Day is for the people in the war because they died. I feel sad when I think about the men who were killed. I think of the people who fought for our country and it is a way of thanking them for fighting for our country."

Treena Griffiths, 300 Delrex Blvd.: "Remembrance Day is for the men that fought in the war and for the men who died during the war."

Deanae Stewart, 32 Raylawn Cres.: "When I think of the war I think of all the men who died. It's a very sad. Remembrance Day is for those men."

Gyn McVittie, 331 Delrex Blvd.: "I think of all the people who saved our country. All of us kids think of the men who saved our country and died."

Lanne Rivers, 17 Weber Dr.: "When I think of Remembrance Day I feel sad. I think of the men who fought for the land that we're standing on right now and many of these men died. If they hadn't fought for this land we wouldn't be here right now. It's really sad to think about. We all should be grateful to these men."

Jim Murphy an 80-year-old war veteran described Remembrance Day, as "The only day we have to remember all those soldiers who didn't return home after the war."

"Well Remembrance Day is a time when many think of both the good and bad times of the war. It's really different when comparing.

"You mainly think of all the battles overseas and of the ones who didn't come back and who won't be coming back."

"In some ways it's very sad when you think of all the fathers, sons, who didn't return but, then you have to think of all the friends you made during that time, but most of all, you have to think of all the fathers and sons which did return home to their loved ones. I guess that is what Remembrance Day is all about."

For many of the veterans, Remembrance Day is indeed a time for remembering the friends, acquaintances and families lost during the war years. And for those who escaped the traumas of war, Remembrance Day is a day to pay tribute to those who fought gallantly for our country and for our freedom.
