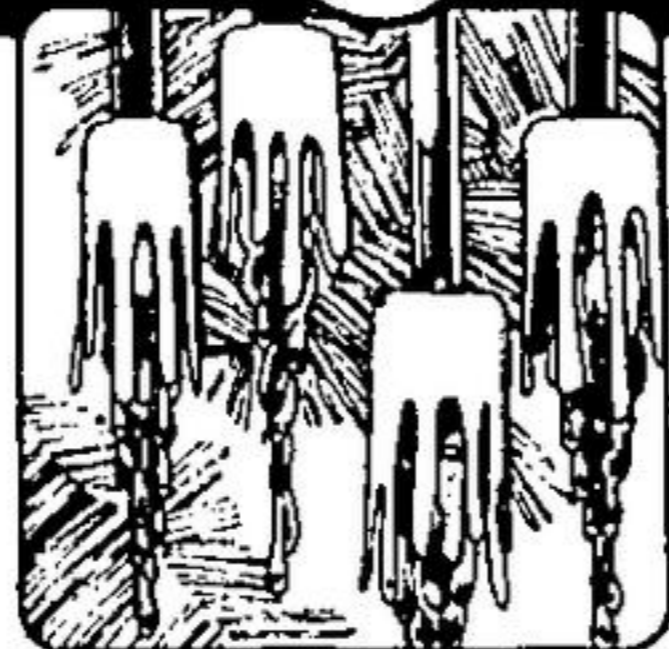

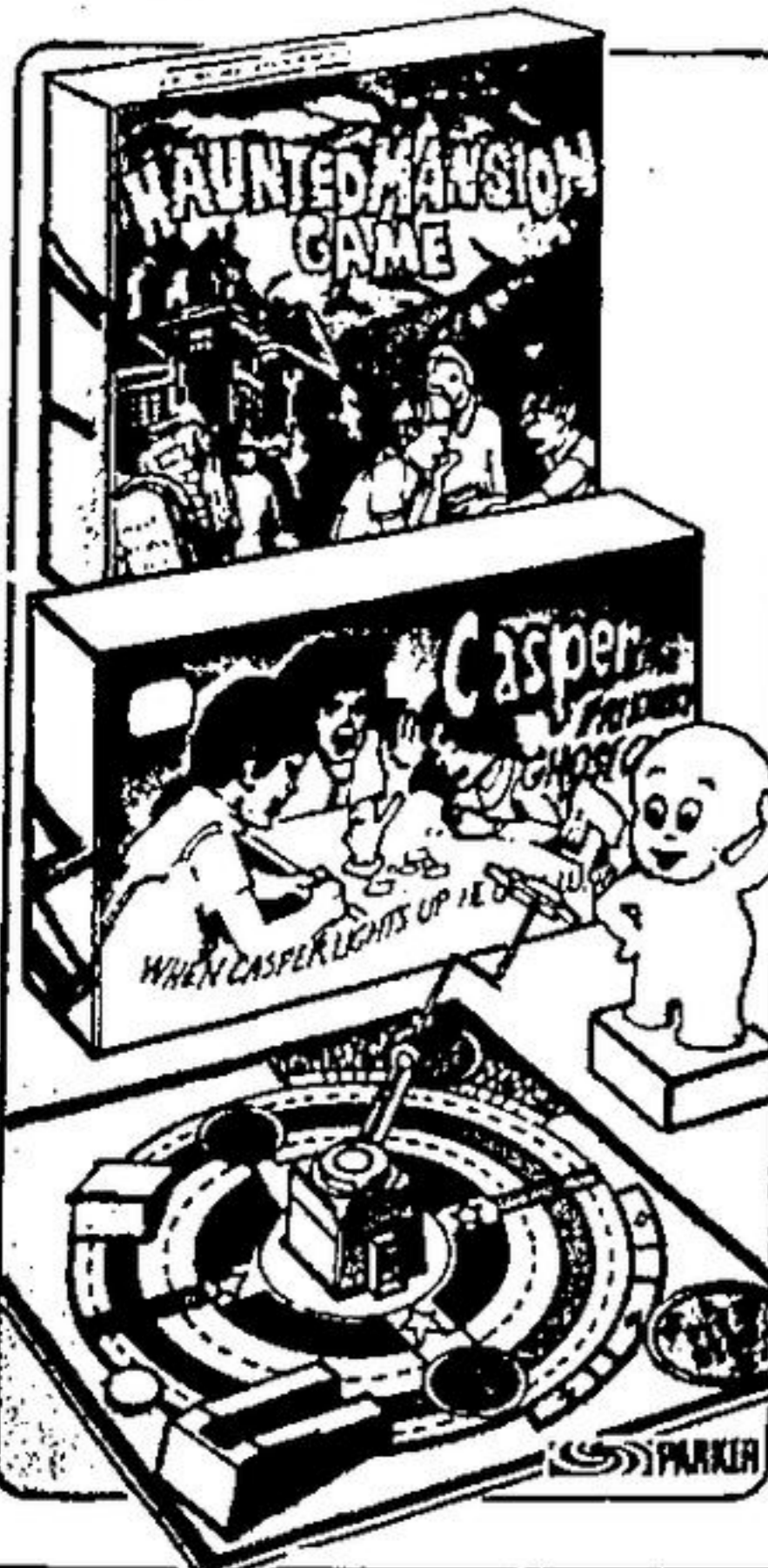

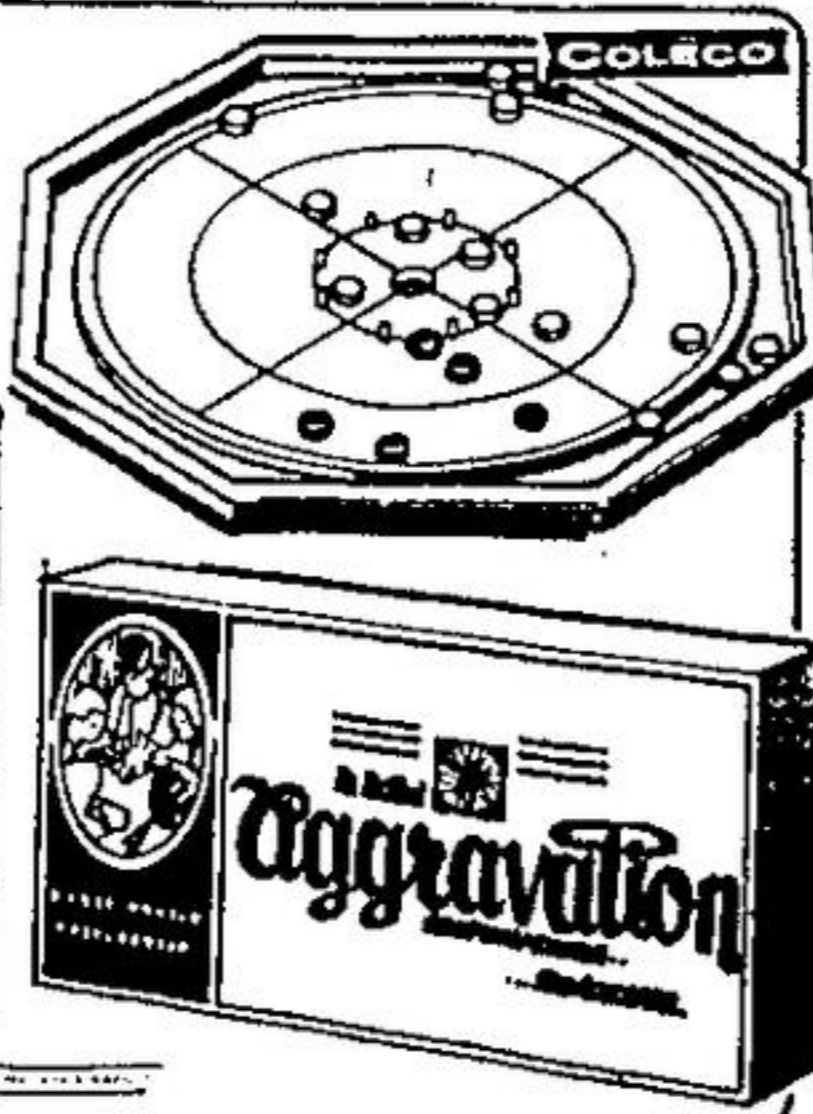

which only \$15.4 million was to be spent.

Provincial treasurer Darcy McKeough has stated that these funds will be spent on programs for the mentally retarded over four or five years but, he said, the province is under no obligation to spend the funds on specified programs.

Two NDP members, Michael Cassidy (Ottawa Centre) and Eie Martel (Sudbury East) this week circulated legislative committee statistics showing the inroads on the economic standing of MPP's. They maintain that some method must be found to adjust members' salaries annually to keep pace with the cost-of-living index.

Two years ago MPP's salaries and expenses were increased from \$18,000 to \$22,500. The current move by the NDP runs counter to the September election campaign promise by Premier Davis that MPP's salaries would be frozen for two or more years.

Mr. Cassidy pointed out that conservative members are in a position to supplement their incomes through paid positions on various government boards and commissions. Housing minister John Rhodes has described the province's \$1,500 grant to first time home buyers as a "gross error" and "utterly silly" because no income ceilings were placed on those eligible to benefit from the program. He said that "it happened that people were buying \$125,000 homes and getting this grant and the money was probably used for a quick trip to the Bahamas."

The government has introduced guidelines giving Ontario women the same access to credit as men, and women's rights activists want these guidelines made law. The minister of consumer relations has indicated that 13 major business associations have agreed to endorse a 12-point set of guidelines guaranteeing women equality, in getting credit. Among the guidelines is a ruling that alimony and child support should be considered as part of a woman's earnings for credit purposes.
