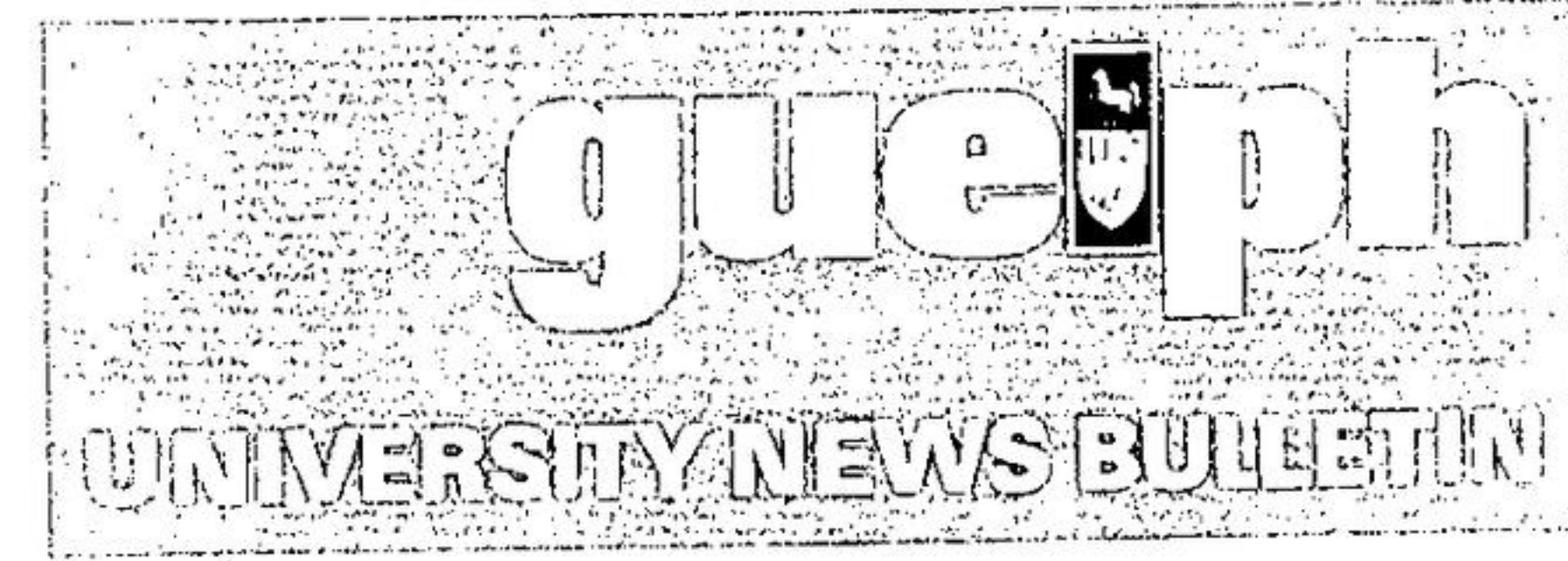

This course will be of interest to those engaged in any field of commerce including banking, accounting, retail sales and manufacturing.

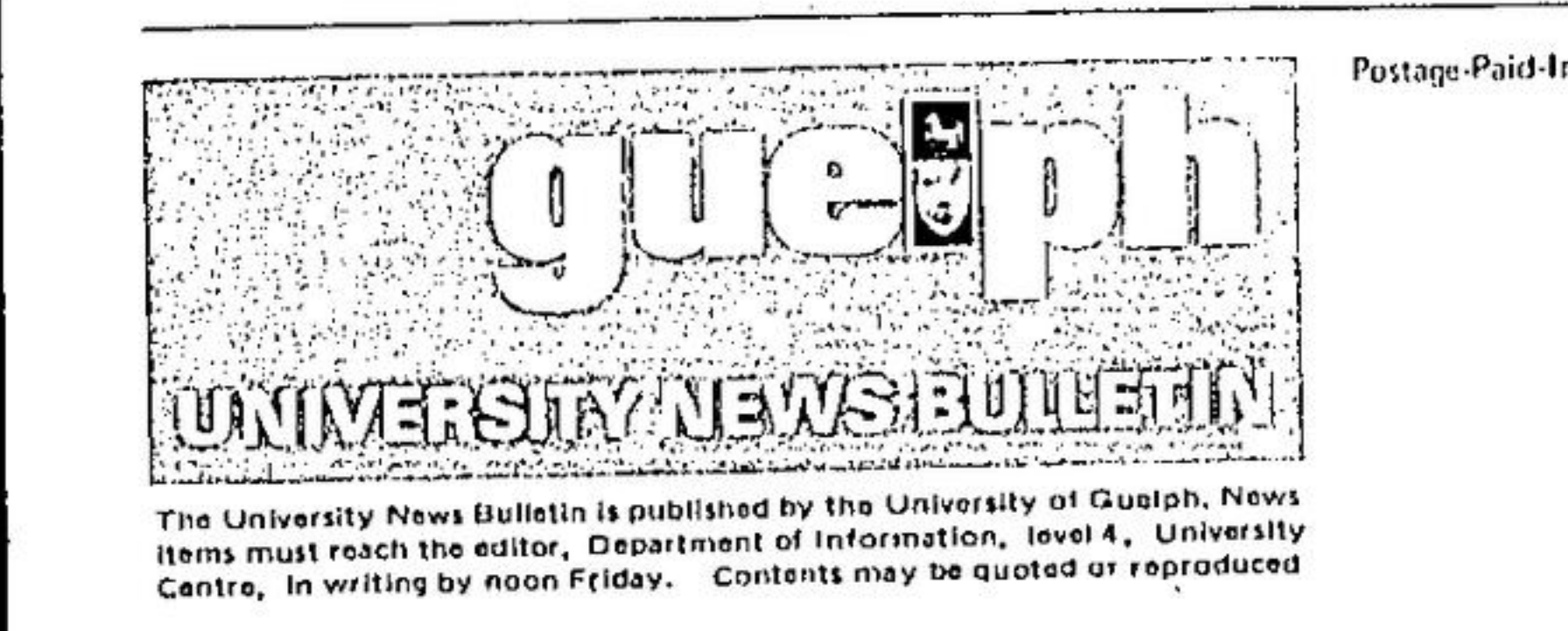
MYSTICISM IN LITERATURE  
Dr. P. Hourihan. 10 evening sessions of 2 hours each beginning Monday, January 26, 1976 at 7:30 p.m. Fee: \$30.00  
The course will concentrate largely on the work of three literary mystics (William Blake, Henry Thoreau, Walt Whitman), their personalities, teachings, and experiences. Thoreau's Walden and Whitman's Song of Myself will be studied. Selected religious mystics, East and West, will be examined for purposes of comparison and deeper insight into the overall theme of mysticism, when a mystical experience is authentic and what mystical experience and mysticism really are.
