# Representative 'not interested'?

To the Editor of the Herald:

I was shocked to read our school trustee Mr. Ernie Bodnar's remarks stating his not being bothered about a few of his constituents' concerns because they don't represent the thinking of the majority. (The Herald Jan. 14, 76)

Does Mr. Bodnar mean that he is not interested or concerned with any individual problem I may bring to him, as one of his constituents, unless I could round up enough parents and children with the same problem in education, so as to form a "majority"? Doesn't our school trustee represent each and every one of us and isn't he concerned about any problem that is facing the children in his riding? Mr. Bodnar's unusual remarks and seemingly unusual outlook begs the question.

Last autumn a small group of parents from Burlington made a presentation of films with a report from their trustee, at a Halton Board of Ed. meeting showing the dangerous construction site and 7-lane highway their children had to navigate daily to get to school.

The extremely worried parents were driving their children to school, so concerned were they of a fatal accident. They asked the board for a school bus to

transport the youngest children, K to Gr. 3, to school. The board agreed the situation looked grave, but refused them a bus because they didn't want to set a precedent. But the board agreed to go themselves and see the site. Parents argued that before the few board members arrived at the site, the workers straightened a few things so as to meet their inspection. As conditions worsened, it prompted the parents back to plead for a bus. Over the objections of some board members, the board tabled the request until the following year, June, to be exact, WHEN SCHOOL IS OUT!

While trustees like Tony Goodyear and Noel Cooper voiced their concerned opinion that the serious situation warranted giving the children a bus, the fact that construction traffic was hazardous around the site, seemed immaterial to our beloved trustee Mr. Bodnar.

I approached Mr. Bodnar and asked if the board would arrange up a bus, if a child was killed at the site the following day. Showing his great concern, Mr. Bodnar replied "Legally we would not be responsible."

Maybe I should have said 50 kids. After all, one dead kid, constitutes a minority.
