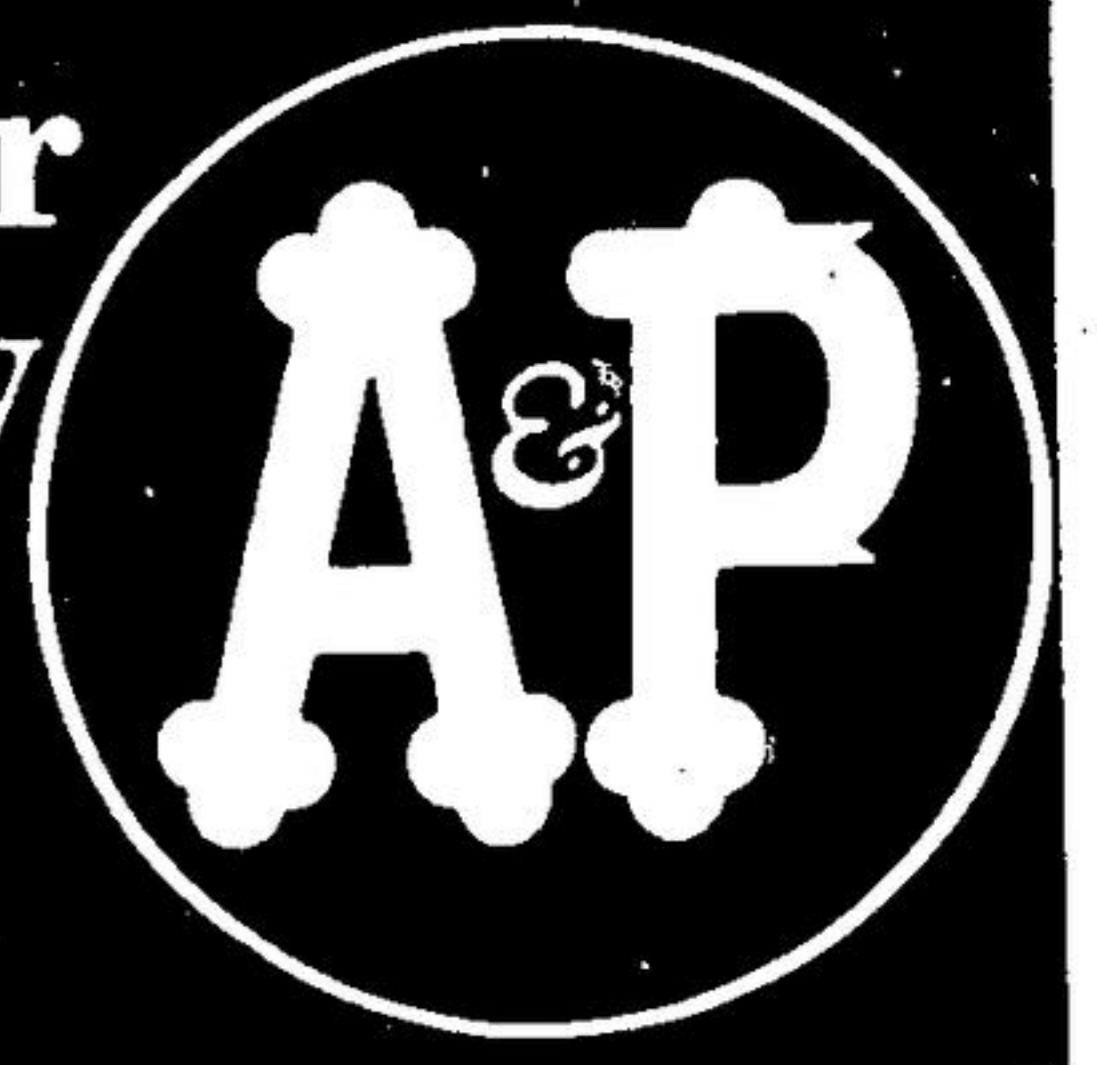
Mrs. Campbell was a member of Orangeville Chapter No. 197 OES and attended Ballinacree United Church.
