

Allison heads Halton-Peel Beef Assoc.

The Halton-Peel Beef Improvement Annual Meeting was held on January 15, 1976 at the Junior Farmer Building, Brampton at 10.30 a.m. President Lee Wilkinson was chairman for the day's program.

There were a number of interesting speakers on the agenda.

Bob Bell, agricultural representative from Peel, spoke on his eight-day trip to England. While there he took in the Farm Show which he found to be a worthwhile experience.

Doug McDonell, assistant manager at the Ontario Stock Yards, showed slides on his recent trip to Argentina. Doug explained that this was a beef-grazing country. Most of the cattle he found to be of the old-fashioned type which are more adapted to range finishing. Inflation in this country in the past year has been over 300 percent. However, it doesn't appear to have struck the beef industry as Doug found prices for fat cattle to be as low as 6c per lb. and cows at 1c per lb.

In the afternoon, Mr. Gordon Small spoke on his beef and hog operation which he works in co-operation with his son. He illustrated his beef setup with slides on his handling facilities and slotted floors. An interesting discussion followed on the problems and assets of his operation. Mr. Small emphasized the importance of adequate manure storage space for at least six months.

The election of directors was conducted by Halton agricultural representative, Henry Stanley. Mr. Keith Monkman, director to the O.B.I.A., reported on the latest developments for the provincial organization. The Halton-Peel Beef Improvement Association voted to support the O.B.I.A. decision stating that the Beef Improvement Association would be the sole bargaining unit with respect to its own commodity. The O.P.A. had earlier suggested that they represent beef producers in any bargaining sessions with regard to stabilization programs, etc.
