NOTICE OF APPLICATION TO THE ONTARIO MUNICIPAL BOARD BY THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF HALTON HILLS FOR APPROVAL OF A BY-LAW TO REGULATE LAND USE PASSED PURSUANT TO SECTION 35 OF THE PLANNING ACT.

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Halton Hills intends to apply to the Ontario Municipal Board pursuant to the provisions of Section 35 of the Planning Act for approval of by-law 75-113 passed on the 15th day of December, 1975. A copy of the by-law is furnished herewith. A note giving an explanation of the purpose and effect of the by-law and stating the lands affected thereby, is also furnished herewith.

ANY PERSON interested may, within fourteen (14) days after the date of this notice, send by registered mail or deliver to the Clerk Administrator of the Corporation of the Town of Halton Hills notice of his objection to approval of the said by-law together with a statement of the grounds of such objection.

ANY PERSON wishing to support the application for approval of the by-law may within fourteen (14) days after the date of this notice send by registered mail or deliver to the Clerk Administrator of the Corporation of the Town of Halton Hills notice of his support to approval of the said by-law together with a request for notice of any hearing that may be held, giving also the name and address to which such notice should be given.

THE ONTARIO MUNICIPAL BOARD may approve of the said by-law, but before doing so it may appoint a time and place when any objection to the by-law will be considered. Notice of any hearing that may be held will be given only to persons who have filed an objection or notice of support and who have left with or delivered to the Clerk Administrator undersigned, the address to which notice of hearing is to be sent.

THE LAST DATE for filing objections will be February 12th, 1976.

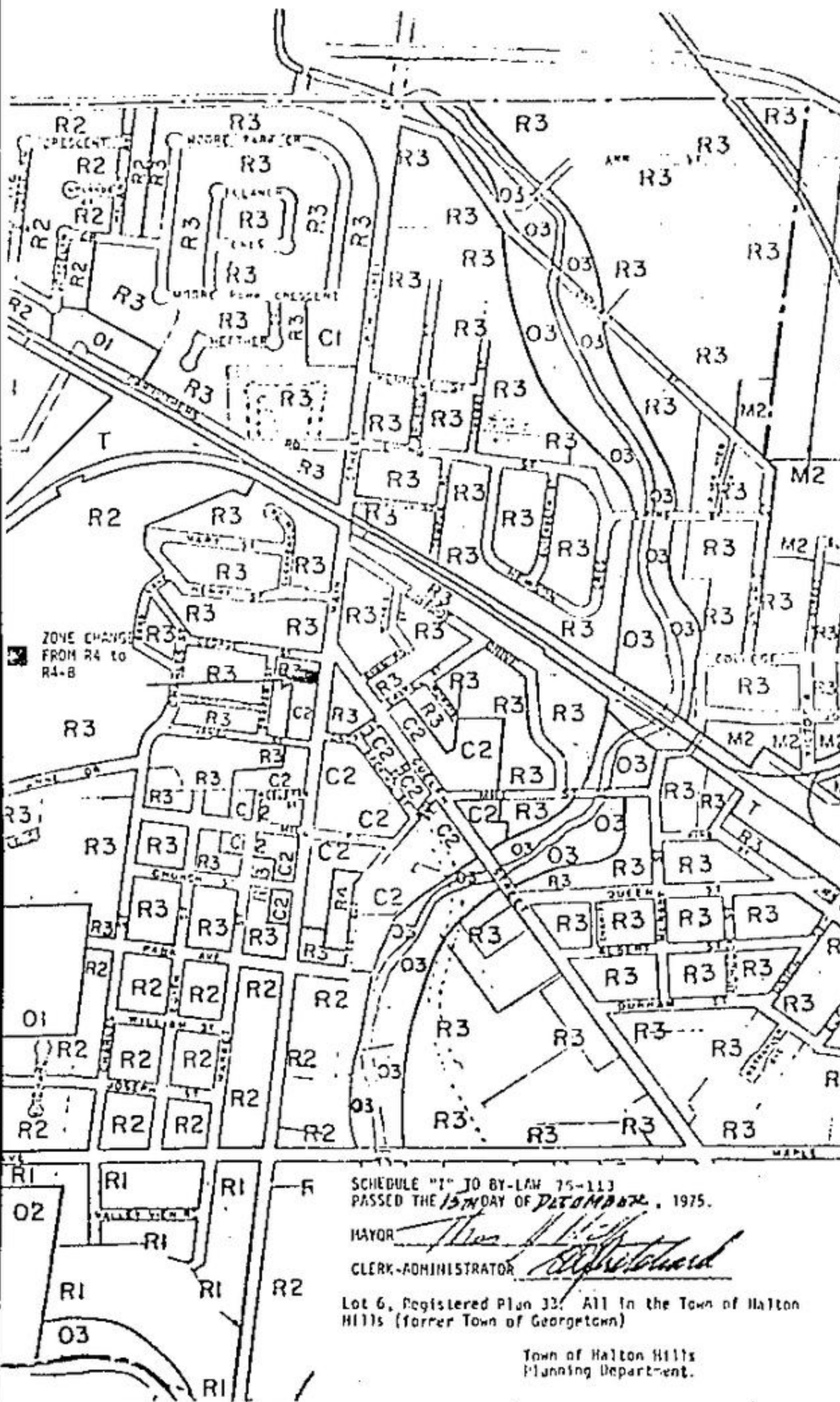

THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF HALTON HILLS BY-LAW NO. 75-113 A by-law to amend by-law 57-91, as amended of the former Town of Georgetown

WHEREAS, Council for this corporation deems it necessary and advisable to amend by-law 57-91, as amended;

NOW, THEREFORE, COUNCIL FOR THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF HALTON HILLS ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

- Schedule "A" to by-law 57-91 is amended by changing the zone designation of those lands outlined on the plan attached to this by-law as Schedule "1", from Residential Third Density (R3) to Residential Fourth Density (R4-8).
- By-law 57-91 is further amended by adding to Schedule "C" a site plan to be known as site plan R4-8 of Schedule "C", a copy of which is attached to this by-law as Schedule "2".
- Section 5 of this by-law 57-91 is amended by adding thereto a new subsection to be known as paragraph number 5.2.4.13 which shall read as follows:



5.2.4.13 Special Provisions
(a) Notwithstanding any provisions in this by-law to the contrary the lands known as Lot 6, Registered Plan 33 former Town of Georgetown, now the Town of Halton Hills are designated R4-8 on Schedule "A" shall be used for no purpose other than one quadruplex (four-plex) dwelling house.
(b) No building or structure shall be hereafter erected, structurally altered, located, enlarged, or maintained on the lands designated as R4-8 on Schedule "A" except in accordance with the provisions indicated on site plan R4-8 on Schedule "C" and in accordance with the following provisions:
(i) Minimum Front Yard 25 feet
(ii) Minimum Rear Yard 35 feet
(iii) Minimum Side Yards 10 feet
(iv) Maximum Lot Coverage 30 percent
(v) Minimum Parking Requirements Four spaces; each space being 10' by 20'.
4. This By-law shall become effective on the date of passing hereof subject to receiving the approval of the Ontario Municipal Board.
BY-LAW read a first and second time this 15th day of December 1975.
BY-LAW read a third time and finally passed this 15th day of December 1975.

THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF HALTON HILLS Amendment to Zoning By-Law 57-91 by by-Law 75-113

Council for The Corporation of the Town of Halton Hills deems it necessary and advisable to amend by-law 57-91 passed by The former Corporation of the Town of Georgetown by changing the zone designation of those lands shown on Schedule "1" to By-law 75-113 from Third Density Residential (R3) to Residential Fourth Density (R4-8) which is a special zone category.

The uses which are presently permitted on the property are set out in Section 5.2.3.1 of by-law 57-91 as follows:

"...single family detached dwellings, public, separate and high schools, churches, parks and playgrounds operated by the Town of Georgetown (Halton Hills)"

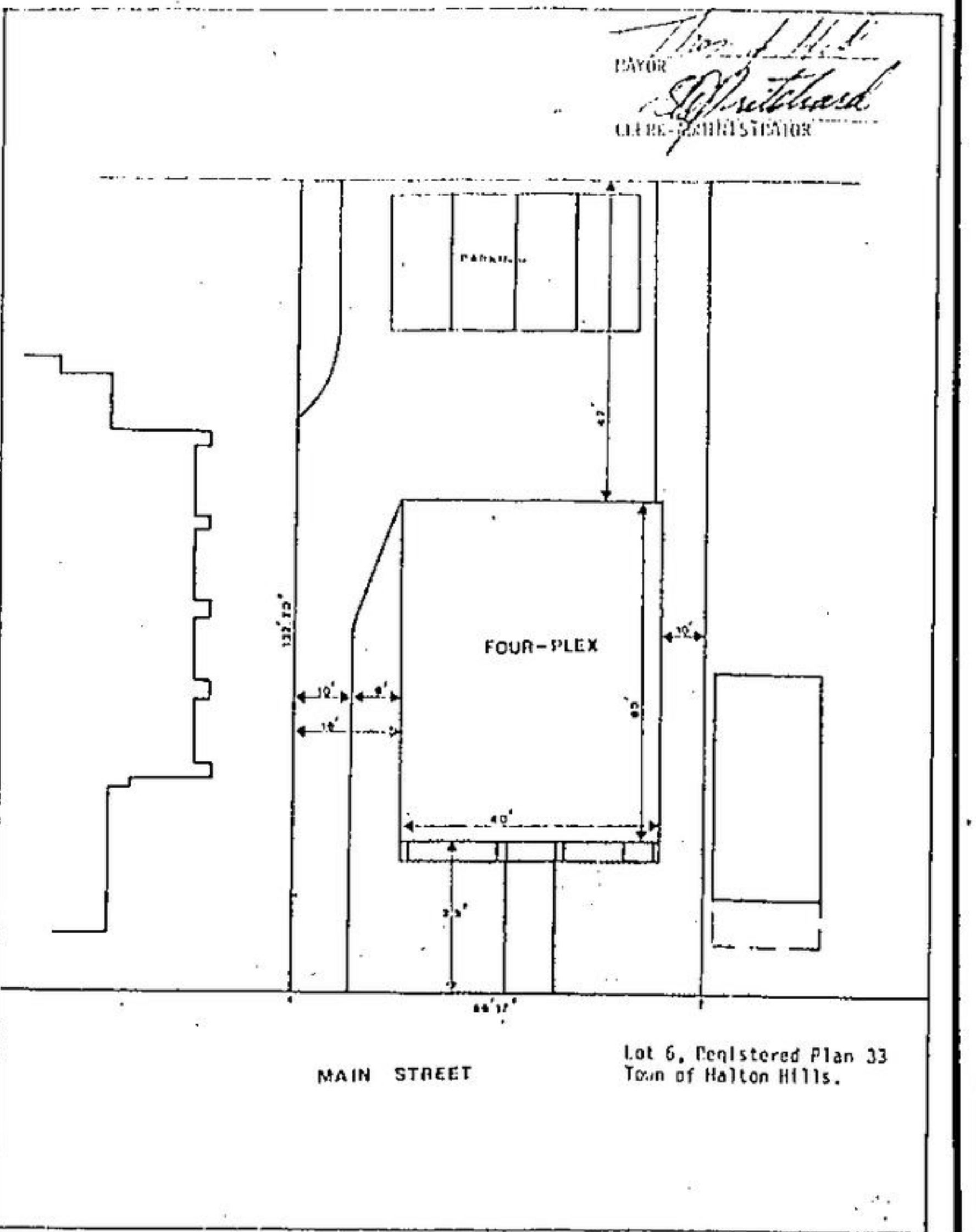
In addition, certain accessory uses are permitted in the R3 residential zone under Section 5.2.3.2 of by-law 57-91 and include private garages and television antennae.

If by-law 75-113 should receive the approval of the Ontario Municipal Board the use which may be made of the property shown on Schedule "1" to the by-law will be restricted to that of a quadruplex dwelling house. A quadruplex dwelling house may be described as a dwelling that is divided vertically by common walls into four separate dwelling units, each such dwelling unit having two common walls. Subsection (b) of Section 5.2.4.13 as set out in by-law 75-113 sets out certain requirements for the quadruplex dwelling unit to be constructed on the property relating to minimum front, rear and side yards as well as maximum lot coverage and minimum parking requirements.

The uses generally which surround the parcel of land to be rezoned are residential in nature with a church close by and commercial uses immediately to the south.

If the by-law should receive the approval of the Ontario Municipal Board the use to be made of the property will be in conformity with the Official Plan in force for the former Town of Georgetown Planning Area.
