



Restricted area By-law 74-51 is a comprehensive zoning by-law affecting all those lands now within the boundaries of the Town of Halton Hills that were formerly part of The Corporation of the Township of Esquesing. By-law 74-51 provides for the roning of the lands within the former Township of Esquesing and in so being regulates the uses which may be made of these lands.

The zoning categories covered by the comprehensive zoning by-law and the uses which may be made in each category are set out in detail in the by-law but include provision for rural, residential, commercial, industrial and open space uses.
