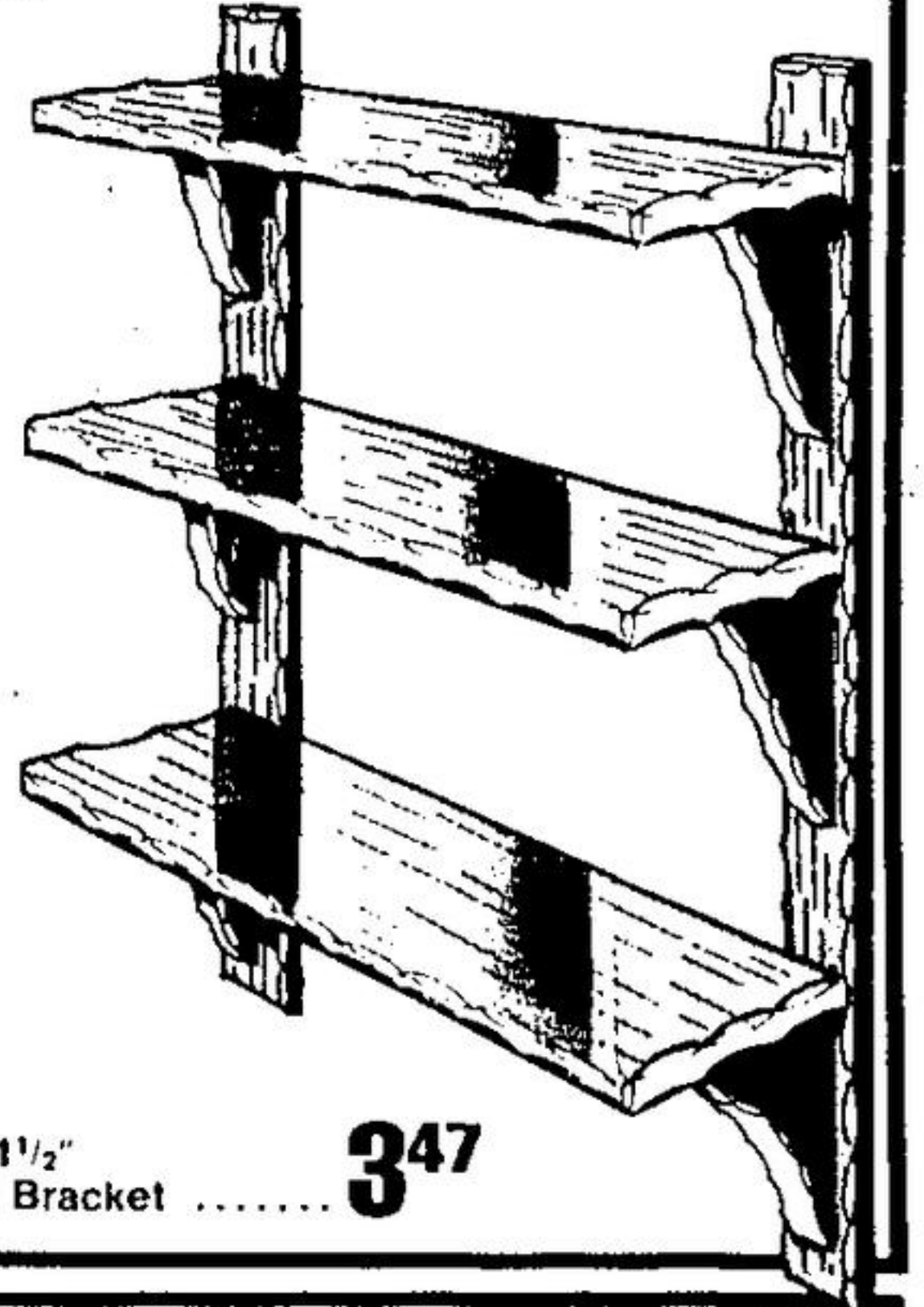

The major part of the \$12,000 in legal fees was a result of having legal representation at
