emphasized our apologies to anyone who might inadvertently be harmed by our issue-oriented efforts to improve the system. . . But never once in these two years has this Board even suggested an apology to any parent offended by Board policy!

Renaissance has at times championed the civil rights of that segment of the society whose moral and cultural values are ridiculed by an atheistic permissiveness which is so popular in the universities where teachers are educated, and in the mass media.

How is it that the civil rights of minority groups who are recognized by their race, or religion or sex even, are scrupulously guarded by the Board, (no offensive references to blacks as "niggers", or to Indians as "drunken", or to Jews or even to women would be condoned in the text-books or the classroom - there is Censorship enforced there and appropriately so). - But the civil rights of those who share a sensitive commitment to the common moral, religious and cultural values identified as "traditional Judeo-Christian" are flagrantly violated and their values ridiculed in this system?

How is it that any appeal for a sensitivity to the conviction of this trans-denominational, trans-cultural, trans-racial, non-sectarian, non-partisan group is rejected and their spokesmen shouted down by educators in public meetings, (as I was shouted down in a Renaissance-sponsored meeting by red-necked reactionary educators in the Oakville showing of Sexuality and Communication), and their values mocked and ridiculed in the classroom and in such public meetings?

This Board has treated Renaissance and some of the minority groups we've sought to represent, the way the Red Necks treated the Black minorities in the South. But like the Blacks in the South, we too "shall overcome" because "our cause, it is just!"

It is this insensitive and unresponsive Board and system which is driving those who are able, out of the system with their children, including concerned Roman Catholic parents who are ready to build a high school for their youth in Halton now.

How long is such a repressive system going to be tolerated and its dehumanizing influences allowed to poison our society?

I beg you, madam chairman, in the name of all that's decent and good in human relations, to lead the Board in decisively correcting the injustices in the system you've been elected to manage!

Give the public educational system back to the people!
