Clive Mullins has earned his artist badge; Ian Brown the pet keeper and Eddy Holtman the green star.

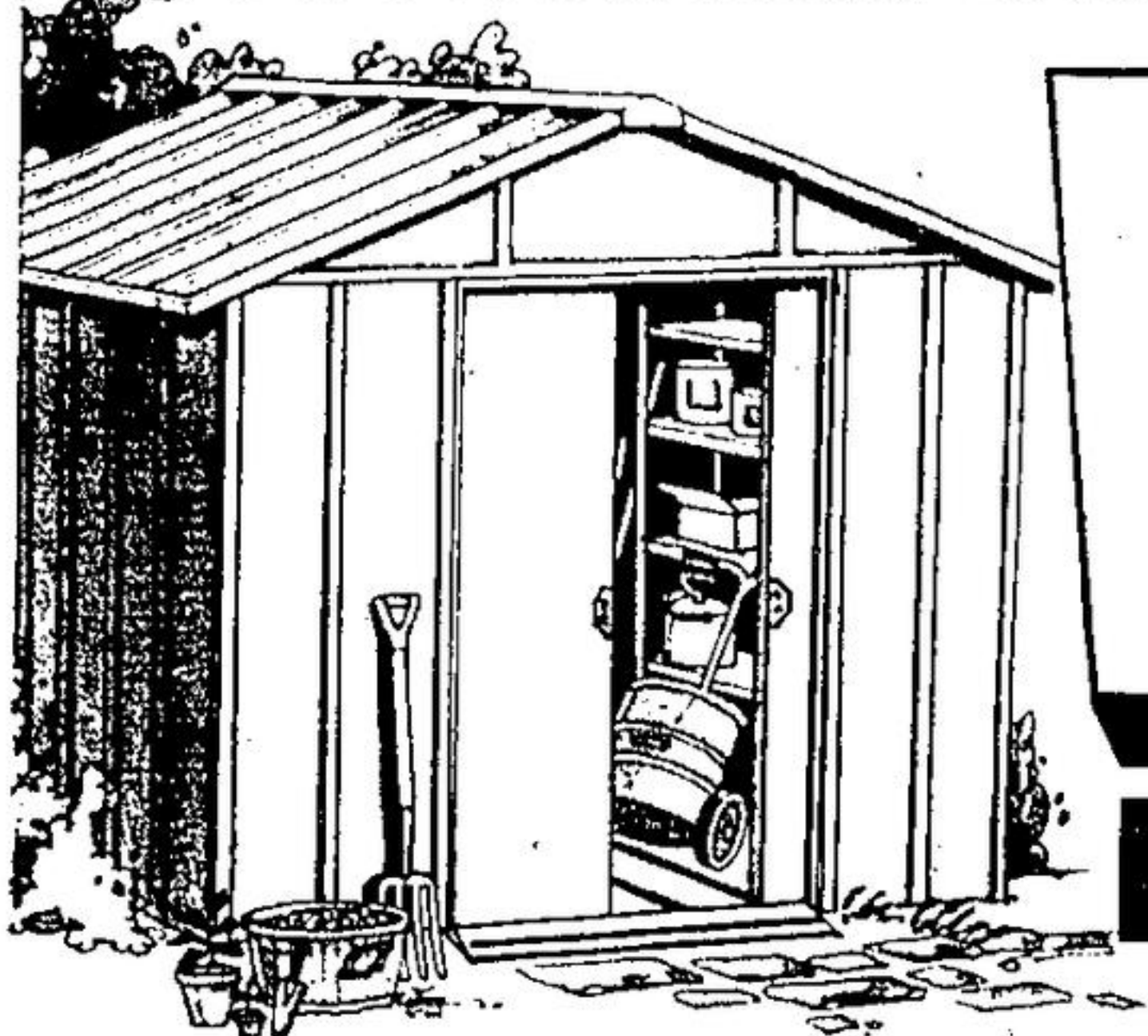

The rollcall, "Little things that make life beautiful" was answered by the six members and the visitors present.

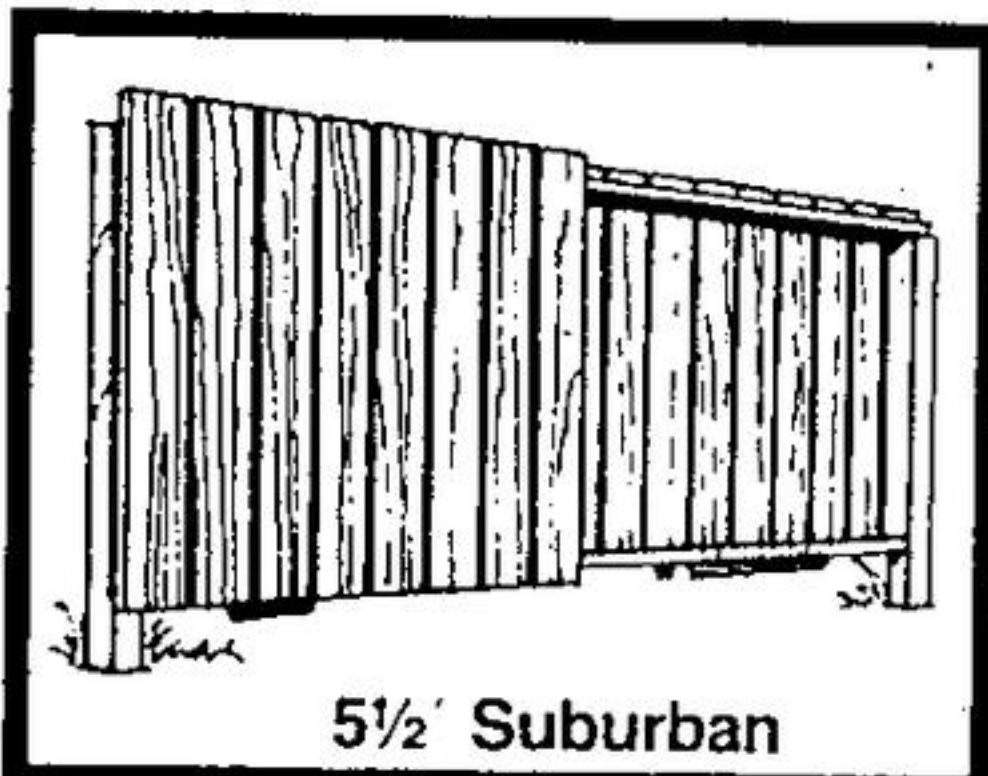

Mrs. H. O'Connor expressed the thanks of the ladies for his talk and presented Mr. Brown with a gift.

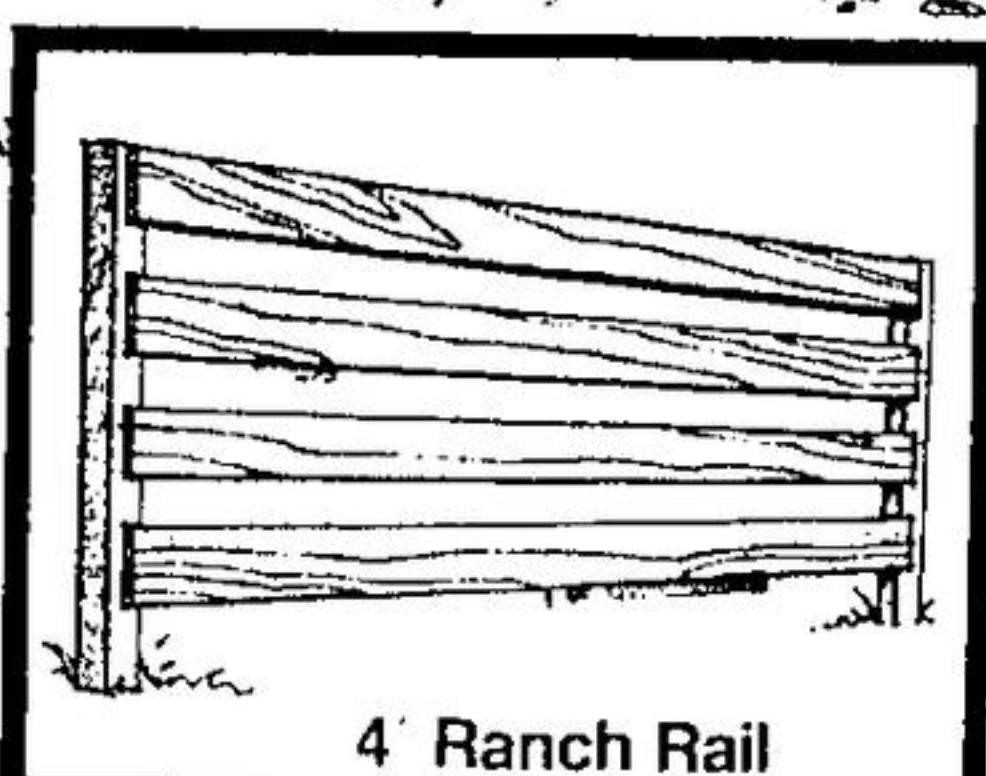

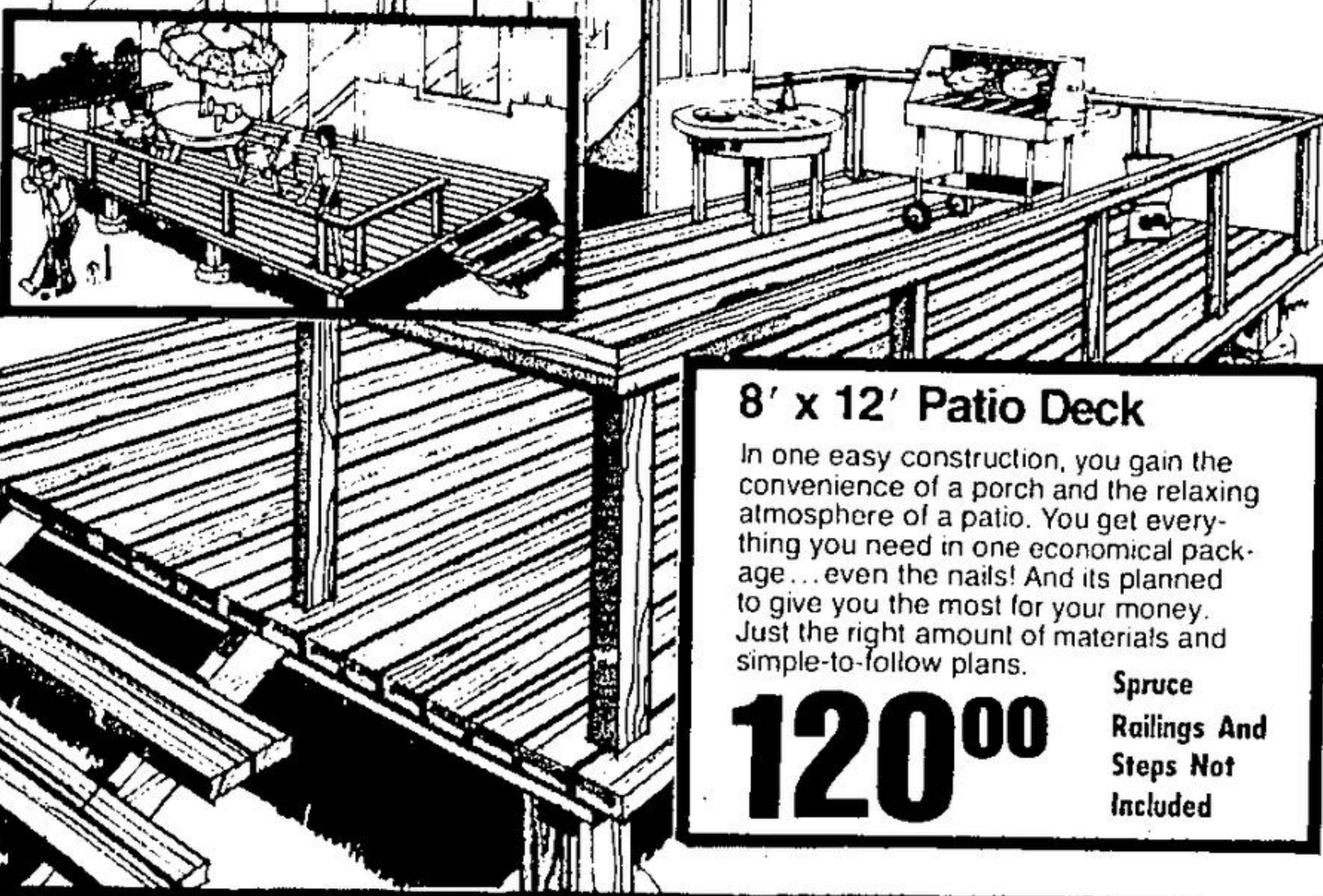

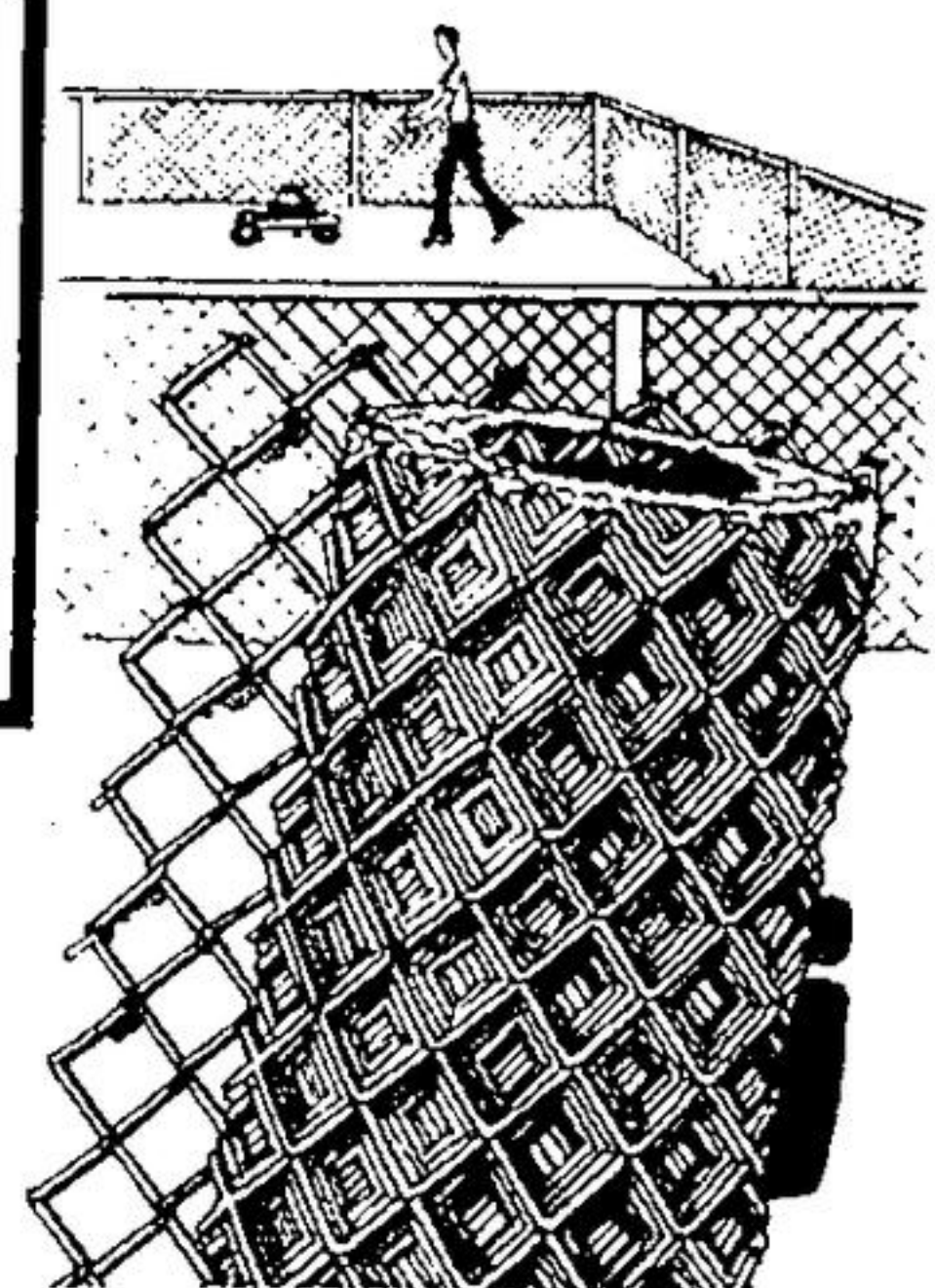
