

# No one injured in week's bumps and grinds

Intersections and parked cars were involved in most traffic accidents last week in Halton Hills.

A truck owned by Charles MacLeod, 18 Edward St. in Georgetown was in collision with a truck driven by Michael Pevec of Kitchener. The mishap took place opposite the MacLeod residence March 22 at 2:30 p.m.

Police estimate damage to each vehicle at \$150.

Maple Ave. and Market St. in Georgetown was the scene of an accident March 22 at 6 p.m. when a truck driven by Donald S. White, 59 Edith St. Georgetown, was in collision with a car driven by Mary F. Muens of Oakville.

Police estimate damage to the Muen's vehicle at \$300 and to the White vehicle at \$200.

Phillip Blinn, 123 Acton Blvd., Acton owned the vehicle which was in collision with one driven by George Burrows of Bramalea March 24 at 2:05 p.m. Damage to the Blinn vehicle, which was at 14 Wesleyan St. in Georgetown was \$150. The Burrows vehicle was not damaged.

The parking lot of the Georgetown Market Plaza was the scene of an accident March

24, at 9:15 p.m. when a car driven by Gordon D. Gopsill, 103 Raylawn Cres. was in collision with a car owned by John H. Packer, 19 Confederation St., Glen Williams.

Police estimate damage to the Gopsill vehicle at \$250 and to the Packer vehicle at \$80.

Damage to property amounted to \$25 in the third single car mishap when a car driven by Mary Ellison, 52 Queen St., owned by Norman Wodham, 44 McIntyre Cres. both in Georgetown, went out of control at the intersection of Mountainview Road N. and John St. in Georgetown.

Wodham's vehicle was undamaged in the mishap. There were no accidents reported in Acton last week.
