## Much At Stake With Mackenzie Valley Pipeline

The magnitude of the Mackenzie Valley pipeline development is unprecedented in terms of capital cost, significance to energy security and impact on Canada's last fron-

Of immediate concern is whether a natural gas pipeline should be built from the Mack enzie Delta and, il so, who builds it. The decision facing the federal government also involves the future of a great river valley and its native people

As envisaged by tederal policy, a gas pipeline is the first development of a Mackenzie Valley transportation corridor, eventually to include an oil pipeline, a railroad, hydroelectric lines and telecommunications facilities

The corrulor's future is entirely contingent on the gas pipeline. The oil industry has made st clear that there will be intensified oil and gas activity in the Western Arctic only if it is

"It is not only the interest of the South in obtaining energy from the frontier that is to be considered, says Mr. Justice Thomas Berger, commissioner of the Mackenzie Valley pipeline inquiry

"So let's do it right and let's not be stampeded into making a hasty and ill-informed judgment on a matter of great importance to the North and to our country ".

LIMATE FAVORABLE

The Mackenzie River carries warm waters from the south, softening the barsh Arctic

environment to make the Mackenzie Valley a relatively habitable area.

Two groups are compeling for the right to build a pipeline Canadian Arctic Gas Pipeline Ltd. of Toronto, a consortium of 16 United States and Canadian companies, and Footbills Pipe Lines Ltd. of Calgary

. Arctic Gas is proposing a 2,-500-mile, 48inch-diameter pipeline to move gas from Prudhoe Bay on the North Slope of Alaska and the Mackenzie Delta to U.S. and Canadian markets

About 24 trillion cubic feet and seven trillion cubic feet of natural gas has been found in Prudhoe Bay and the Mackenzie Delta, respectively.

Most of the delta's remaining gas potential has not yet been confirmed. The Arctic Gas project would cost an

estimated \$10 billion, with more than \$7 billion earmarked for the Canadian portion Mr Justice Berger describes it as "the greatest project, in terms of capital expenditure, ever undertaken by private enterprise anywhere "

PROJECT ALL CANADIAN\*

Footbills is owned 80 per cent by Alberta Gas Trunk Line Co. Ltd. of Calgary and 20 per cent by Westcoast Transmission Co. Ltd. of Vancouver, the main gas-transmission companies in Alberta and British Columbia. The \$4.5-Inflian Foothills proposal is for an all-Canadian line using smaller, 42-inch pipe to move delta gas to Canadian markets only Arctic Gas has another rival

El Paso Natural Gas Co of Houston, Tex., is proposing a \$7-billion, all-American project to pipe North Slope gas to the ice-free port of Valdez on the south coast of Alaska, where it would be liquefied and shipped by tanker to

The presence of oil in the Mackenzie Valley has been known since 1789 when Alexander Mackenzic journeyed to the Arctic Ocean on the river named after him and saw oil oozing from the ground.

As early as 1888, the Geological Survey of Canada put the Mackenzie Valley's energy supply into perspective.

"Its remoteness from the present centres of population . . . will probably delay it de velopment for some years to come, but this is only a question of time."

STAICTED IN 1973 Drilling in the Beaufort Sea started in 1973 when Imperial Oil Ltd. built the first of many man-made islands.

Most of the remaining oil and gas potential in the Mackenzie Basin lies under the Beaufort Sea.

A consortium to study the feasibility of an oil pipeling from the delia, the Calgary-based Beaufort-Delta Oil Project Ltd., has five members: Imperial, Shell Canada Ltd., Gulf Oil Canada Ltd. Interprovincial Pipeline Ltd. and Trans Mountain Pipe Line Co. Ltd. Canadian Marine Drilling Ltd. (Canmar), a wholly-owned subsidiary of Dome Petroleum

Ltd of Calgary, has applied for permission

Canmar was given approval in principle by the cabinet in 1973 on the condition that final drilling authority would not be issued before th summer of 1976 and until the findings of the Beaufort Sea project have been assessed. BLOWOUT POSSIBLE

for offshore drilling in the Beaufort Sea.

The project, completed last year, was an 16-month, \$12-million environmental study of

the risks involved in Beaufort Sea offshore ()ne of the project's study reports said the worst that might happen would be an un-

derwater oil-well blowout. Such a blowout, although unlikely, would take at least one year to bring under control. None of the damage would be irreversible but recovery to the ecology, in some cases, might

take as long as 10 years. Chief Justice Berger was appointed in March, 1974 to head the inquiry to examine the social, economic and environmental impact of the Mackenzie Valley development.

The inquiry is expected to end in September and Mr. Justice Berger said he hopes to submit his recommendations to the federal cabinet by the end of this year.

There has been criticism that the inquiry is moving too slowly, but Mr. Justice Berger

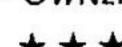
