September deadline set for chairmanship program in Halton

Using Acton High School as an example of how well a chairmanship program can operate in a high school, the Halton Board of Education has set a September, 1977 deadline for all Halton secondary schools to switch to chairmanship systems.

The switchover will see the end of department heads and, in their place, the organization of a system based on one chairman for every 130 students with a maximum of 12 per school.

The chairman besides handling the duties of the former department heads will relieve teachers in their particular areas of instruction for "curriculum development and educational pursuits," plus provide "current information to staff regarding methodology, curriculum, etc. in the area of studies."

has been a very big bone of contention between the board and District 9 of the Ontario Secondary School Teachers Federation.

According to the John Boich, superintendent of program, that has been because "OSSTF" has preferred to maintain the status quo. The federation, he said was opposed to the promotions and demotions that would occur if chairmanship programs were adopted.

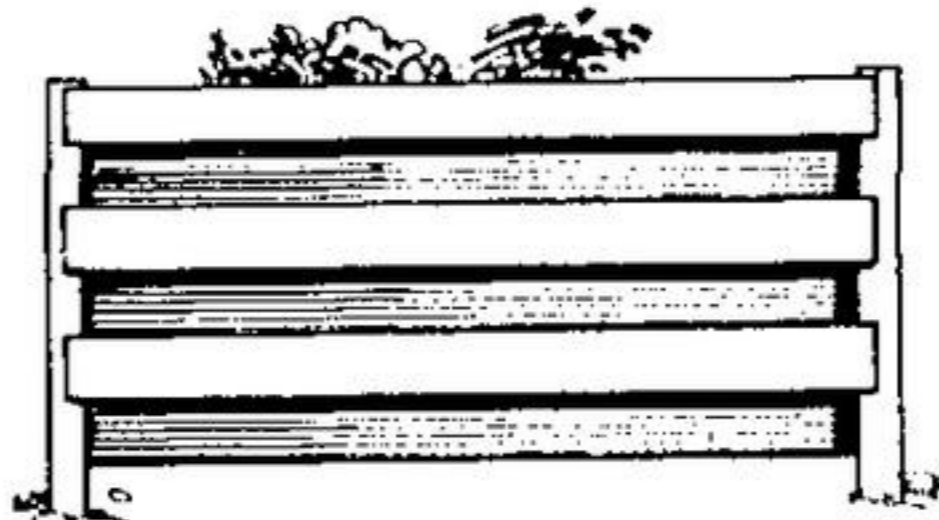
