There was also a lesson and a quiz on the status of dairying in Ontario. This was followed by a film on mild quality.

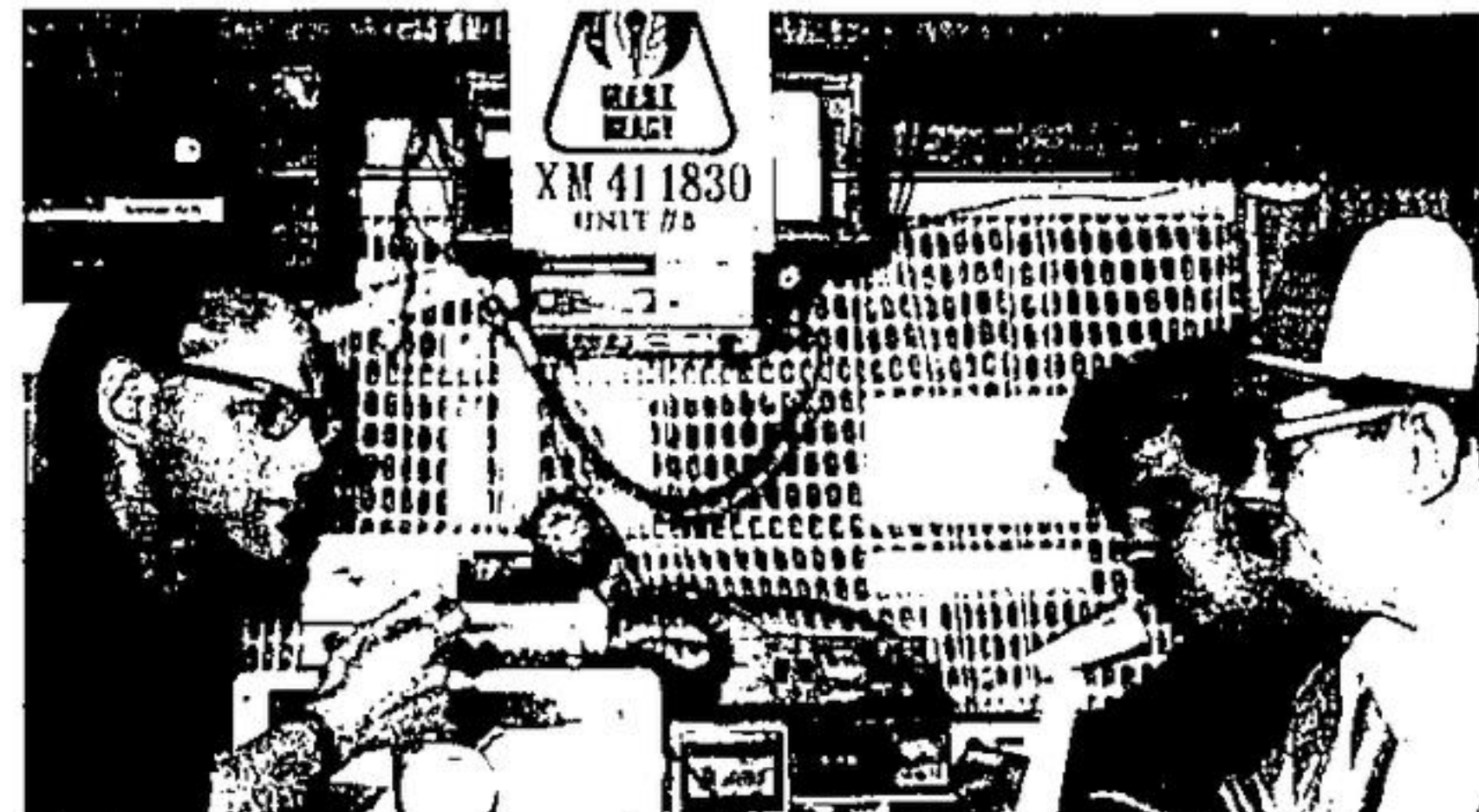
Acton 4-H Calf Club - Brenda Brown
