Barbershoppers sing for Hornby-Pineview Scouts

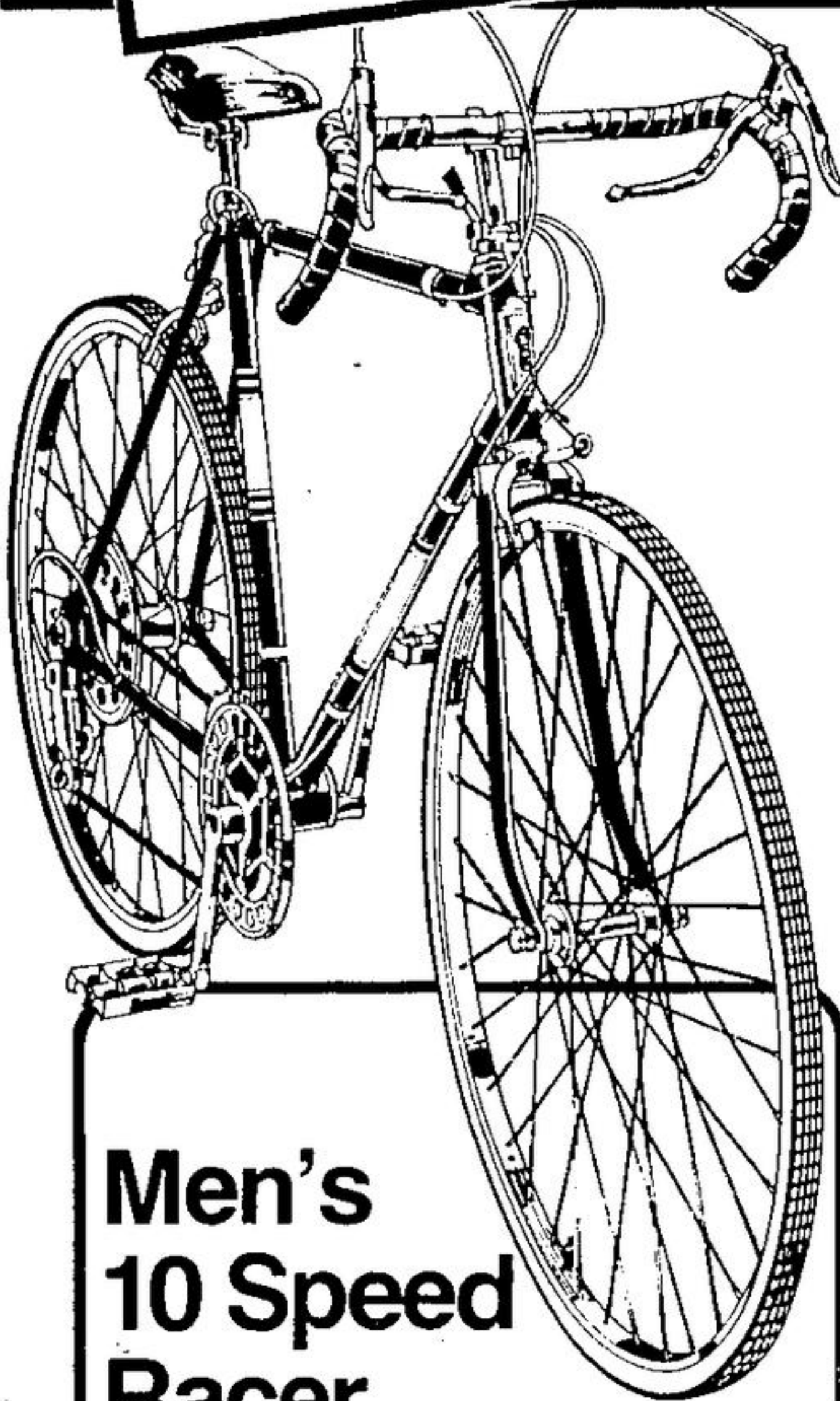

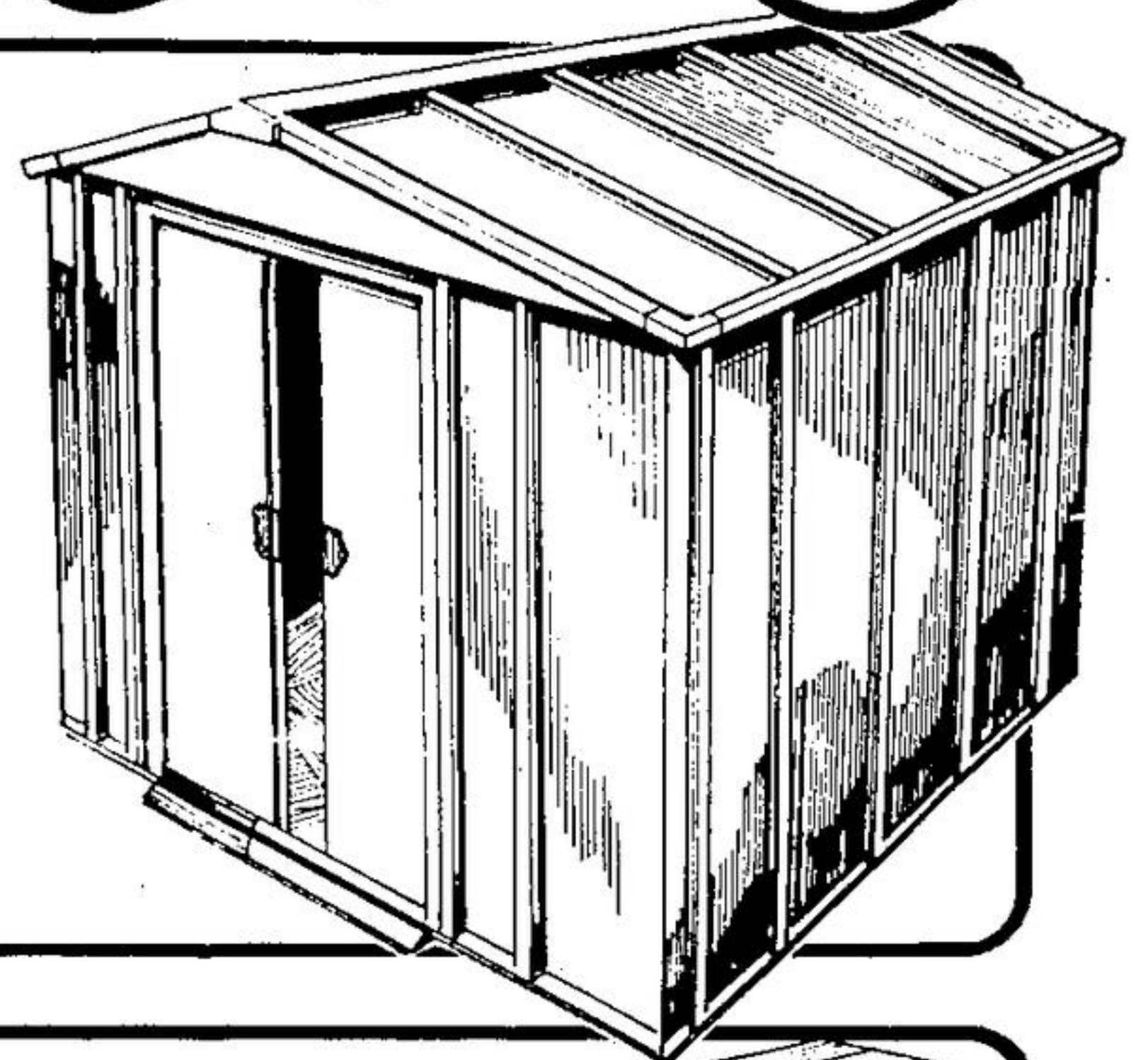

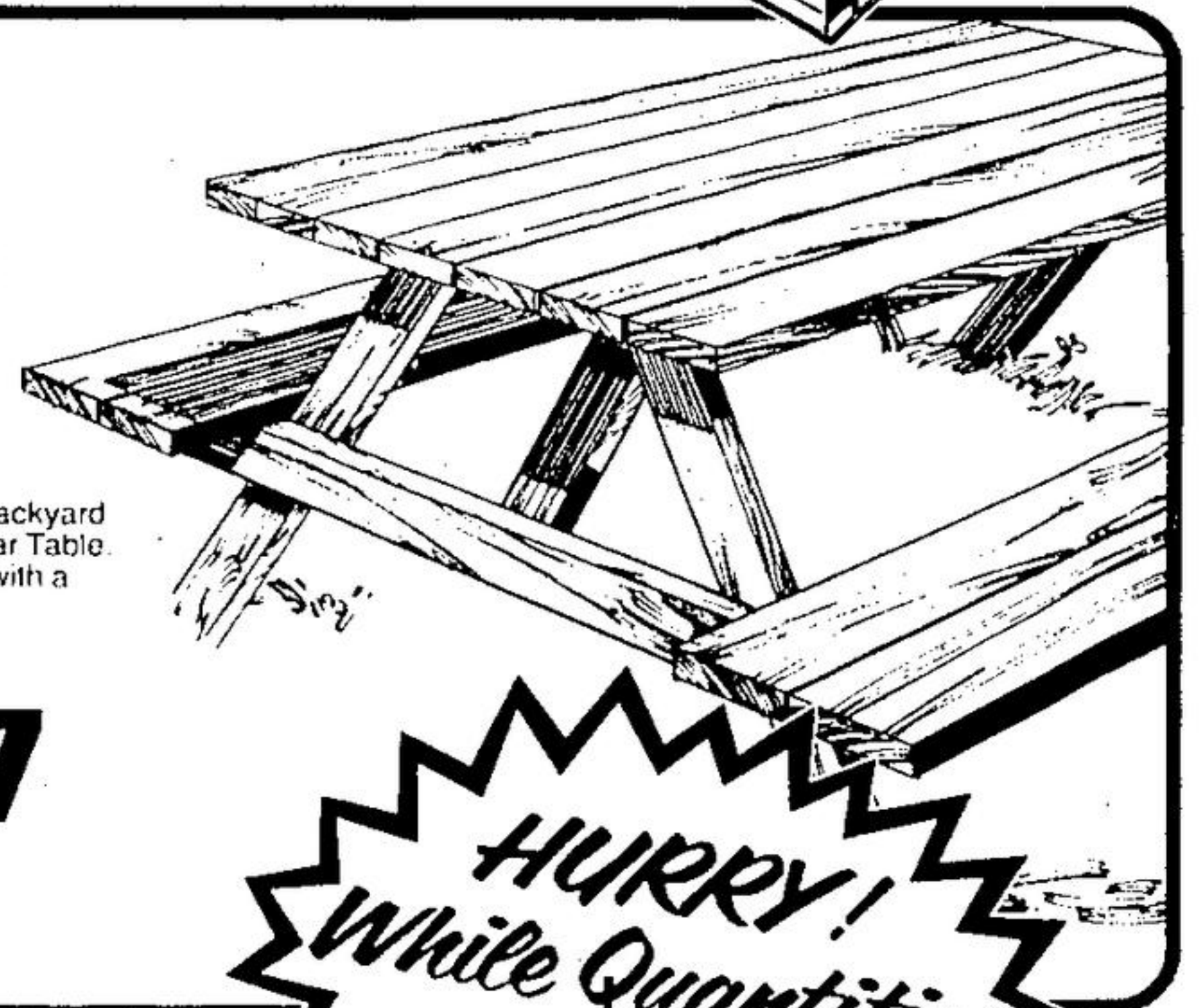
