

Squadron 756 on parade

The Cadets of 756 Squadron of the Royal Canadian (Air) Cadets, sponsored in Georgetown by Branch 120 of the Legion, held their eighth annual inspection Saturday night at Georgetown District High School.

Colonel John R. Barber E.D. C.D. (Ret'd) inspected the Cadets and said it was the first time he had been on parade with a unit of the Air Force.

Col. Barber told the assembled Cadets that he was a Cadet in high school in 1918 and that after 50 years of continuous militia service, he would do it all again.

After a march past and general salute, the squadron presented a precision drill display and a first aid display, then re-formed to accept a number of awards.

Captain Colin A. Cousens, C.D., Commanding Officer of the squadron presented 28 pins for perfect attendance at weekly parades. He said it was the largest number of perfect attendance pins presented in his memory.

"It certainly is indicative of the keen interest," he said.

The Queen's Commission was presented to two squadron officers at the parade Lieutenant Anne Smith, who joined the squadron as adjutant when girls were allowed into the squadron in 1974, and Lieutenant Colin Vernon both received the Queen's Commission from Halton-Burlington MP Dr. Frank Philbrook.

A certificate of appreciation was presented to Mrs. J. Fields by Captain Colin Cousens.

Seven trophies were awarded to Cadets during the parade.

The Air Cadet of the Year was given to Warrant Officer

1st Class Don Cousens by Dennis Wright, president of Branch 120 of the Legion.

The Initiative and Enthusiasm Award was given to Sgt. Alan Vernon by Norman Ward, past president of the Legion.

The Leadership award was presented to Flight Sergeant Al Dalton by Ron Lincoln.

The Best Junior Non-Commissioned Officer award went to Corporal J. Doumouchel-Shield and was presented by MPP Julian Reed.

Leading Air Craftsmen John Egerton won the trophy for best first year Cadet which was presented by Harold Badham, vice-president of the Legion.

Best Dressed Cadet was Sergeant John Buchanan who received his trophy from Don Forrester of the Air Cadet League.

The Marksmanship trophy was won by Warrant Officer second class, Brad Kruger who received the trophy from Murray Parsons, Range Safety Officer.

Captain Cousens announced at the parade that Warrant Officer first class Don Cousens would be spending five weeks in the Netherlands this summer as part of an exchange programme.

Warrant Officer second class, Brad Kruger would be spending five weeks this summer in Cold Lake, Alberta, said Captain Cousens and Flight Sergeant John Smith would be going to Camp Borden.

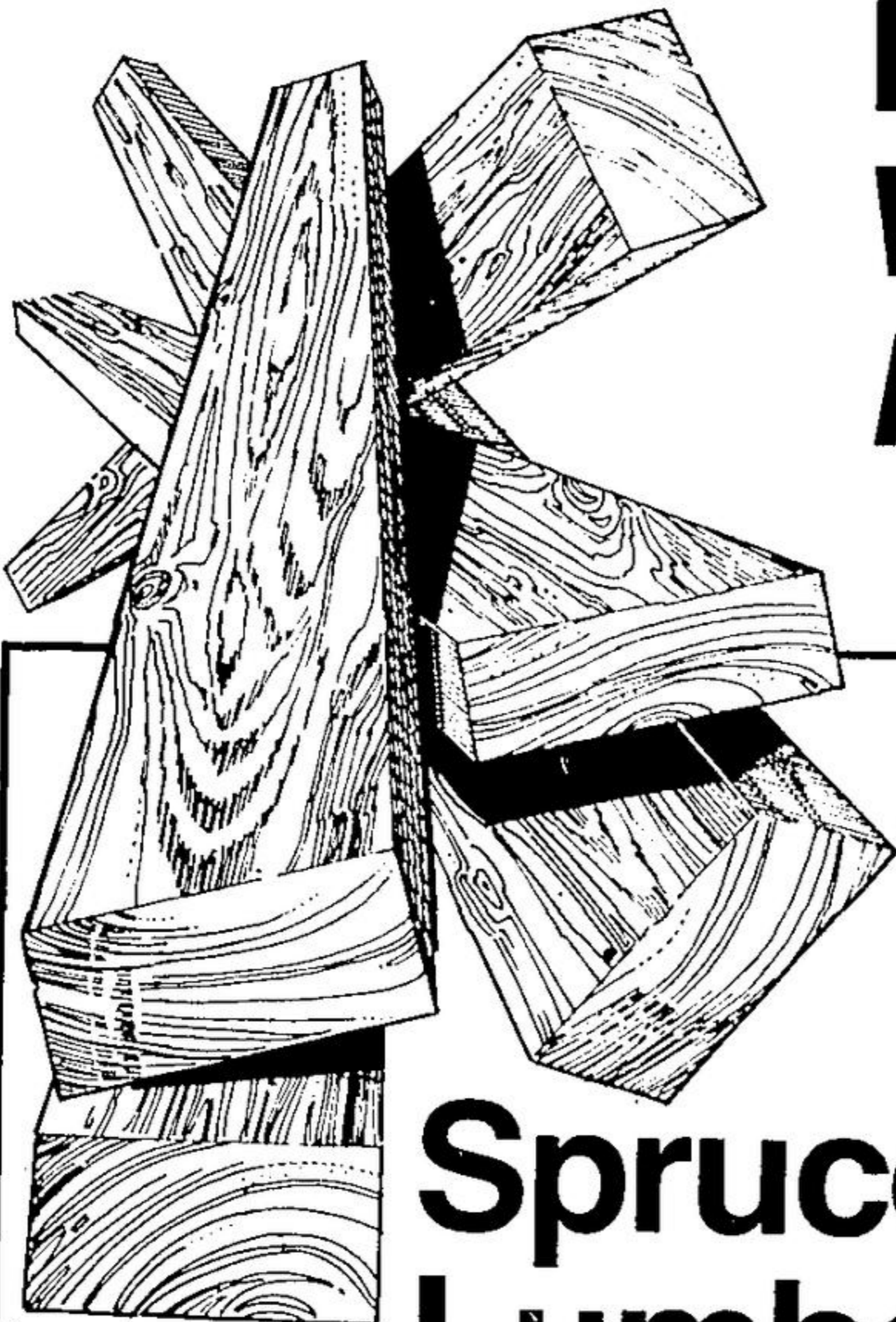
The summer camp this year will begin July 5 at Trenton and 15 Cadets would be attending, said Captain Cousens.

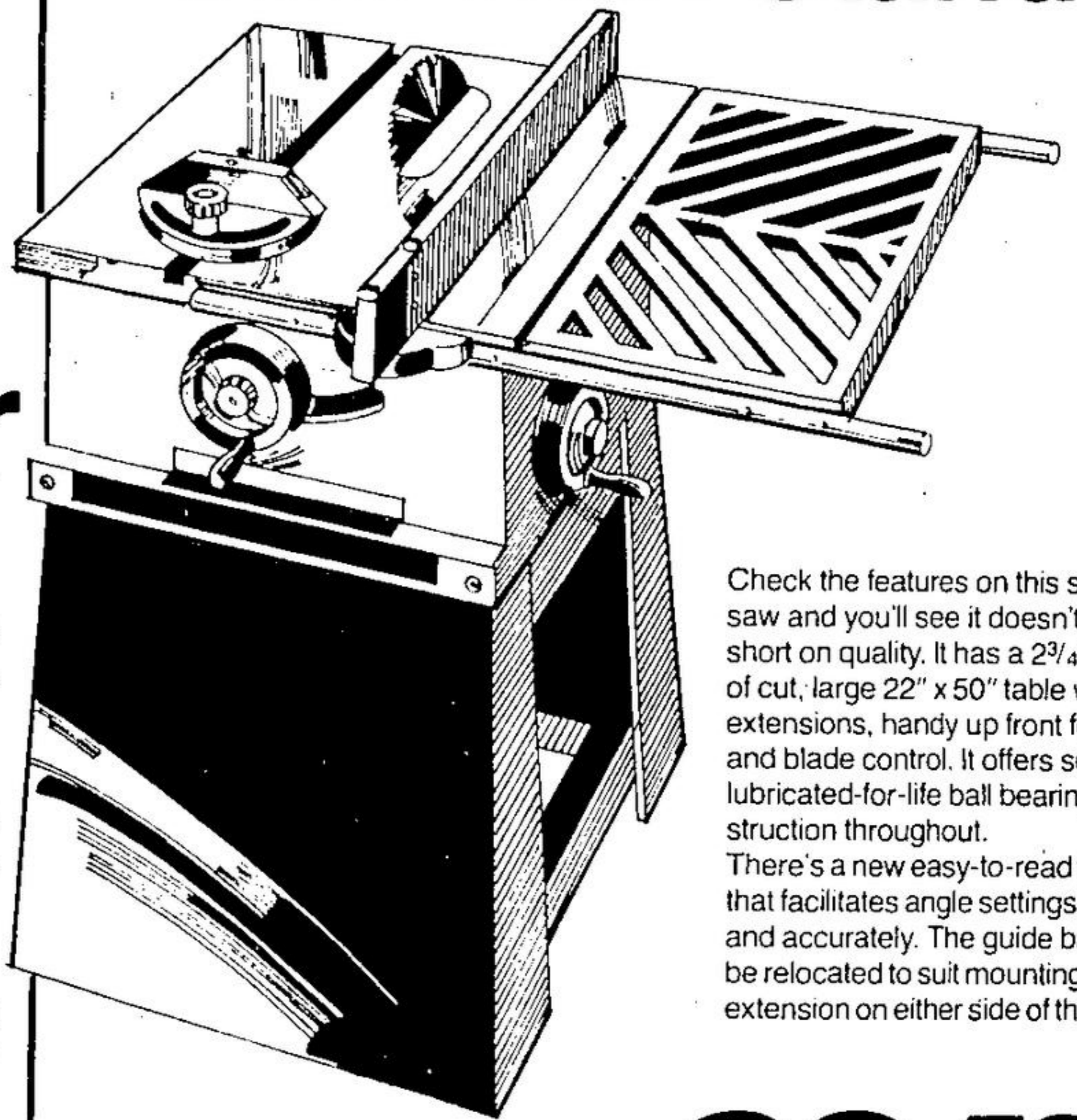
