# Leslie Clan hold Golden Jubilee for original pioneer family

The descendants of Halton's original pioneers celebrated a Golden Jubilee Reunion on Saturday, June 5 at "Heraldo", the beautiful farm of Mr. and Mrs. Herbert Dolson, Lot 3, Concession 6, West Chinguacousy. "Heraldo" is one of the farms obtained from the crown by the pioneering Leslie family.

The following history of the Leslie Clan is taken from a book "Historical Sketch of the Leslie Clan, 157 Years in Canada, 1819-1976" prepared for the Golden Jubilee Reunion by Mrs. Roy Gordon of RR3

"John Leslie and Letty Ann Boke were married in the County of Tyrone in Ireland. They came to New York in 1817 and stayed there for two years. They received an Order from the British Consul to gel land in Canada. Letty Ann and one daughter died in Montreal en

"John and sons George, Standish. In 1828 James

James and John Jr. and married Lydia Williams and in daughter Margaret, arrived in 1834 John Jr. married Jane Esquesing Township in Halton County in 1819 and settled on Crown Land Lot 22, Tenth Line, Esquesing.

"At this time the land was all their 60th wedding anwoods, no houses, no roads with nothing but trees and swamps. The country had been surveyed as the land was available from the Crown. It is important to realize the hardships and dangers from wild animals, cold and starvation suffered by those early pioneers who came to this

unbroken forest. "They had to find a place where water would be available and often with only an axe to clear a space, build first a shelter and then a log cabin. How they managed to get food to survive is a mystery as the nearest mill was in Oakville. They couldn't grow grain for a while.


