Tossing the caber, a traditional Scottish sport, was won by Mike Milligan of Kitchener, with a throw of 37 ft. 11 ins., at the Speyside Highland Games held in Georgetown Saturday.

Over 10,000 visitors watched the colourful events of the day-long Speyside Highland Games.

George Galloway, Georgetown, came close with 37 ft. 2 ins., and Fred Riding of the Metro Police placed third with 34 ft., 4 ins.

The Georgetown Firefighters out-pulled the Georgetown Volunteer Ambulance troop in the Tug-of-War, but were defeated by the Brampton Fire Fighters in the final match.

Mike Milligan of Kitchener was victorious in two out of three shotput throws. Fred Riding of the Metro Police placed second in the 16 pound class and Georgetown's Bill Campbell was runner-up in the 35 pound class.

Both Al Mooring and George Galloway threw the 56 pound put upwards 14 ft. 8 ins., but Mooring was declared winner because Galloway didn't match him until his second throw.

Out front by 204 feet and half an inch, Fred Riding claimed the honours for the Farmers Walk with 467 ft. and half an inch over Bob Whitman of York Regional Police (263 ft.) and Chuck Mitchell of Georgetown (242 ft., 1 in.) Little Ann Milne took the spotlight in the Baby Class for Highland Dancers, while R. Woodley (B Miners Class), Cathy Cadieu (Novice Class) and Mrs. D. Collins, (Intermediate) all claimed top prize in their categories.

The MacDonalds Tobacco division of the Highland Dancing competitions saw Julie Braybrook and Cheryl Verriere tie for first in the age 8 to 16 open class and Beth Jerman win over the other 17 year old and over entrants.

Piping events, bringing back memories of echoes through heathered hills filled much of Saturday.

Amateur pipers, divided into four classes, were free to enter both the Strathspey reel and the March. Competition was stiff.

The results of Grade 1 of the Reel were: I. Kirkwood, first, with 93; I. Forrester, second with 91; and L. Crawford, third with 88.

C. Forrester gained top honours for Grade 2 of the Reel, with 84. Following closely were T. Bowen, second with 83, and B. Rollo, third with 82.

In the March piping contest, L. Kirkwood, 93, and I. Forrester, 92, placed first and second again, respectively. In Grade 1. With a close 91 1/2, D. Pringle almost shared the second place laurels.

In Grade 2, B. Rollo was triumphant with 87, while T. Bowen achieved second with 85; just above third placer C. Forrester, 85.

Again a mark of 87 claimed top honours; this time for W. Reid in Grade 3. Second place S. Henderson placed second with the same mark and K. Buckley deserved third for 85 1/2.

Grade 4 winners D. Easton boasted of 68 while runner-up E. Renfrew earned 66 followed by third placer K. Duncan, 65. Points, totalling 93, won the Open Piping March contest for I. Worrall, just a peck above J. McGillivray with 92 and J. Watson with 91 1/2.

In the Strathspey reel in the open class saw W. Livingstone win top honours with 95 1/2, I. Worrall placed second with 93, and J. McGillivray wind up with 92.

Victorious in Grade 1 of the Pipe Band Competitions were the Toronto and District Caledonian troupe with 95, followed by Clan McFartene with 90 1/2, and the Erskine Pipe Band with 91.

In Grade 2, first placers St. Andrews had the same mark as runner-up Toronto Scottish band: 86 1/2. The Burlington Legion earned third place with 81 1/2. The Glenmor Pipe Band was named winner of Grade 3.

Deserving first place in Grade 4 was the Chippawa Legion with 82 1/2, followed by the Downsview Junior band with 80 1/2, and the Scottish Society of Windsor wound up with 79 1/2.
