

Time curfew eliminates Georgetown Royalettes

The Georgetown Legion Royalettes made it all the way to the semifinals in the highly rated Dorchester tournament last weekend, before bowing to a powerful Ambury team, 8-7, in a game called because of the time limit.

The prestigious tourney attracted teams from Byron (London), Kitchener, Cedar Hill (Scarboro), Dorchester, Ambury (Toronto), Brantford, Weston, Shakespeare as well as the Royalettes. Leading up to the semifinals, the Georgetowners had beaten back challenges from Brantford, 7-5, and Weston 10-1.

The Brantford game was decided in the bottom of the seventh, when the Royalettes rallied for two runs. With one out, Diane Marshall walked and was moved to second on a sacrifice bunt by Charlene Milton. Barb Curry got on base on an error, then Betty Marchmont doubled in the runs to end the game. Barb Curry picked up the Georgetown win.

The locals had a relatively easy time of it against Weston, with Laura Wilkes and Betty Marchmont sharing mound

duties. Janet McKay provided most of the power as she bombed a triple with the bases loaded.

In the semifinals, the Royalettes were pitted against Ambury, a strong "A" entry. A halt because of a tournament time limit was a disappointment to the local cause, but even in defeat, the Royalettes showed that they can handle themselves against top level competition. The issue wasn't decided until Ambury's bottom of the sixth, when they picked up their run, but then time ran out before the Royalettes could get a turn at bat.

This weekend, the Royalettes will become embroiled in another tournament battle, as they will journey to Hillsburgh on Sunday to take part in a Junior Invitational Tournament. The locals are looking forward to the challenge of facing the older junior clubs.

Six wins in six outings, by the Georgetown Legion Royalettes, have them vying for the top spot in their Juvenile league. Last Thursday, the Royalettes humbled

Eringate, 10-5 their last Monday night Chin-guacousy, the Georgetowners triumphed by a 6-4 count.
