
## Rams blow chance to clinch berth



# Royalettes first

The Georgetown Legion Royalettes warmed up for their weekend tournament by posting their eleventh league win in a row, a 16-B romp over Eringate last Tuesday evening

at the Georgetown Ball Park. The win allowed the Royalettes to move four points in front of second place Alderwood in the Peel County Juvenile league. Alderwood is the defending league

Against Eringate, the verdict was in almost before the jury left the box. Eringate scored one run in their opening inning then the Royalettes amply demonstrated why they lead the league.

The Georgetowners wracked up 11 runs in their half of the second to put the contest out of reach. Eringate picked up single runs in the third and fifth innings and added two runs in the fourth and three runs in the sixth. However, by the sixth frame, the Royalettes had built up a comfortable 16-5 lead.

Laura Wilkes was credited with the win, she worked the first three innings, and part of the last two frames, while

Barb Curry hurled the middle innings. Betty Marchment and Charlene Milton each went four for five at the plate and it looks as though Betty is back in form. She has won the team batting crown for the last two years, hitting .612 two years ago and .608 last year. Barb Curry was also potent with the lumber as she hit four for four.

Team Coach, Ted Wilkes used 12 players in the game and has confidence in all his charges. As he noted, "The team spirit is great and the girls just can't be faulted." There has been something of a change in the Royalette game format this year, but it is a welcome change.

In the past, the team relied very much on it's stingy defence to get out of tight spots. This year, although the defence is holding it's own, the Royalettes forte has been their hitting. Wilkes is hoping that the bats will continue to arnoke when provincial play begins, sometime in late July.

League standings just released show that it will more than likely be a two team battle, between the Royalettes and Alderwood for the league championship. Third place Dundas has only eight points, six points behind second place Alderwood. Four teams will qualify for the league playoffs, with the first place regular season finisher tangling with the fourth place team and number two going against number three. It is expected that the Royalettes will be rated as an "A" team for provincial playdowns.
