Silver Creek plans

Silver Creek conservation area was unveiled Thursday to the Credit Valley Conservation Authority's recreation and parks advisory committee, but there was no quorum and no action was taken on the proposals.

William Coates a consultant employed by the CVCA to study 2,000 acres of land in the Silver Creek area for possible conservation authority use, unveiled the plan showing three alternatives.

He said in a conversation that up to 1,800 acres of the study area are used in each of the three alternatives. The CVCA now owns about 1,200 acres of land in the area including the Terra Cotta conservation area.

No date has been set for the proposal to be formally presented to the committee.

Each of the three plans differ, but provision has been made for land uses for the Bruce Trail, hiking, horse and snowmobile paths. Also included in the plans are several day use and camping sites as well as a demonstration farm.

Mr. Coates said the final design may incorporate one of the three proposals or a combination of the three plans depending upon the future needs of the conservation authority. Some land may have to be purchased or traded.
