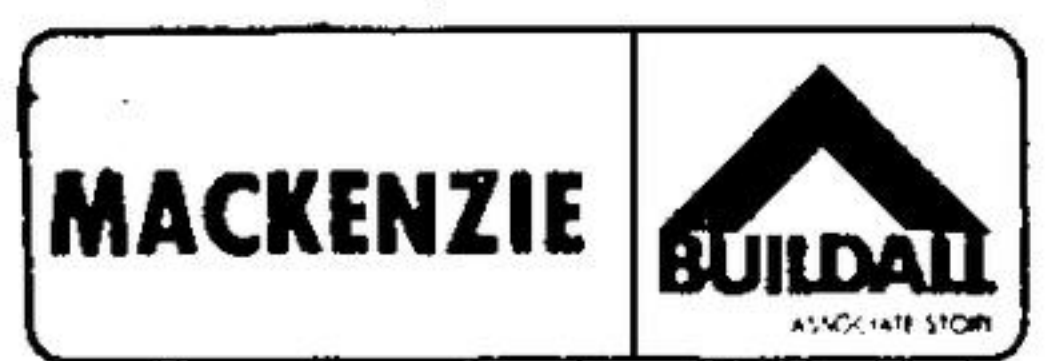

## Two alleged frauds at Canadian Tire stores

Police have two male suspects in alleged frauds at Canadian Tire Stores in Georgetown and Acton, Sept. 28.

### Contract award

A federal contract worth \$17,303 has been awarded to Varian Associates Ltd. of Georgetown to provide the defence department with electron tubes the department of supply and services has announced.

It was one of 198 unclassified contracts worth \$10,000 or more that were awarded by the department to Canadian companies during the week ended Sept. 13. Total value of the contracts amounted to \$7,793,303.

In both incidents a carburetor was returned to the store for a cash refund of about \$60. Investigation of the returned equipment by store personnel revealed the carburetors were probably stolen from a Brampton Canadian Tire Store, police said.

The Trans Motion Car Club was broken into Sept. 27 and thieves stole a torque wrench, block and tackles, torches, wrenches and screwdrivers, a welding tank and an arc welder, police said. Entry was gained by forcing the rear pedestrian door of the River Road club.

Police are investigating an assault which took place Oct. 3 in the municipal parking lot on the west side of Mill Street where the driver of a car which entered the parking lot at a high rate of speed narrowly missed a Georgetown man.

Police said the pedestrian and the motorist exchanged words after which the pedestrian was assaulted.

### No pick-up for firemen

A proposal for the purchase of a four-wheel drive pick-up truck for the fire department approved by tender July 27 has been declared redundant by council.

A recommendation of the general administration committee for the purchase of the \$7,900 vehicle was rejected by council Monday.

Arguments that the vehicle was to be used only for fire prevention and inspection work were leveled by Coun.

Ern Hyde. He said that under present policy the proposed purchase was not approved by the Halton Hills Volunteer Firefighters Association.

The firefighters differ in view from Fire Chief Ken Buikema over the need and use of the vehicle, he said. Council approved a call for tender of a water tanker truck required by the department subject to acceptance by the 1977 council.

## Jelinek helps promote small business

OTTAWA—Otto Jelinek, Progressive Conservative spokesman for small business policy, will visit a number of Canadian centres this fall to discuss measures to promote small business with interested groups and individuals. Opposition Leader Joe Clark announced today.

Jelinek, M.P. for High Park-Humber Valley, will begin his informal tour tomorrow (Saturday) by participating in a small business discussion with the National Executive Secretaries of the Chamber of Commerce in Montreal.

His itinerary then calls for meetings in Hamilton (September 29), Ottawa (October 2), London (October 6) and Peterborough (October 21). During the first half of November, he also will visit St. Ste Marie, Winnipeg, Vancouver and Halifax.

Jelinek will complete this phase of his program by attending an international symposium on small business in Washington, November 15-18.

Jelinek, formerly president of a sporting goods manufacturing company, was appointed by Clark last April to take on special responsibility for developing small business policies on behalf of the P.C. Caucus.
