Mike accepted an athletic scholarship to East Tennessee State University and in his first major test as a University freshman runner, he won his event. The East Tennessee Buccaneers, ranked fifth in the U.S. last year, held a dual meet with the University of the South and completely dominated the competition, winning the meet by the whopping margin of 45 points.

The first eight positions in the race were taken by East Tennessee State runners, with Georgetown's Dixon, leading the pack. Mike breezed home in first place with a time of 29:56.

The next hurdle for the Buccaneers and of course, Mike, was the Indiana Invitational Meet. Results were

not available at press time, but Dixon was competing against runners from such strong running schools as Western Kentucky, Tennessee, Indiana and Michigan.
