### RESTORATION OF GEORGETOWN MEMORIAL ARENA

Last winter the Provincial Government issued new regulations and changes in the Building Code as it pertained to public institutes, arenas and community centres. On close investigation of the Georgetown Memorial Arena, It was found that structurally it was deficient in some areas due to metal stress and fatigue, and wood deterioration. Consequently, It was closed for a full investigation and for the protection of the users."

Recently, the Treasurer of Ontario announced that an additional Assistance Grant from Wintario funds would be available to all municipatities who had closed their arenas because of the above Building Code changes.

However, in order that the Town of Halton Hills could avail themselves of this grant, they must abide by the stipualtion contained in the grant that 25 per cent of the tost of renovation must come from public subscription and not from taxation.

The following is a brief breakdown of a plan to comply with the stipulation:
