The consulting engineering hired to design Wallace Street completed

Town engineer Robert Austin told the works committee the intent is to make Wallace Street a "highway-type road" with an asphalt surface passable 12 months of the year requires "substantial maintenance", he said.

Having a design allows the town to acquire property needed at both ends of the roads, Austin said. The proposed design would exceed ministry of transport and communication standards where the road intersects with Main Street N. (Hwy. 25), he
