Comment causes umbrage

Halton Hills Coun. Ric Morrow took umbrage Wednesday at a remark by Oakville Coun. Bill Mason that facts surrounding the Pilutti townhouse development on Maple Avenue were not as presented by him.

Mr. Morrow, responding quickly to the remark, noted that none of the facts presented by him have been refuted by regional council or members of regional works staff.

He noted as well that Halton Hills council last week approved the payment of the almost \$10,000 cost of the installation of water services along Maple Avenue because it was not fair to the developer to pay after he had signed an agreement.

More than one month ago regional works committee ordered the removal of an illegal connection to a four inch water service on the roadway.
