

\$4,000 netted in canvass

The fundraising drive conducted by the Georgetown Arthritis Society yielded about the same this year as in 1975—\$4,000. Publicity chairman Doug Tucker said about 200 volunteers covered the Georgetown area during the three-day blitz and he expressed appreciation to both volunteers and donors. Money will be sent to the provincial head office, to be used for research into the causes and cures of arthritis; and for public education, said Mr. Tucker.

Mushroom plant site endorsed

Town planner Mario Venditti told the planning board last week that despite objections by Park Street residents it is physically impossible for the Meadow Glen mushroom operation near Glen Williams to be set back further than 200 feet. Neighbors who complained that the compost covering the mushrooms creates an unpleasant odour requested the mushroom bed be moved back 400 feet, Mr. Venditti said. He added that after several inspections of the mushroom farm a system to discourage flies was working, and the owner has plans to construct a four-walled structure around the compost, enabling fumes to escape through the open roof. Planning board consented to a zoning change from industrial to rural because no industrial buildings are located on the property utilized for mushroom cultivation.

Permits up over \$13 million

Halton Hills building permits issued to the end of October totalled \$13,411,165 in value. The figure includes the issuing of permits valued at more than \$663,500 during the month ending Oct. 31. Largest single category for permits issued were for residential dwellings other than single-family dwellings. Fourteen permits were issued at a value of \$280,000. Two additional single-family dwellings were permitted for a total of \$112,500. Seventeen alterations were allowed while permits for swimming pools and garages and car ports totalled three and six respectively. Two occupancy permits were issued by the building department and 29 plumbing permits valued at \$699.

More extended care needed

Halton Centennial Manor is expected to require more beds for extended care patients in coming years. Administrator Stan Allen, speaking at administration committee, said a waiting list for such admissions continues despite a recent approval of a 10 per cent increase in the number of beds available. Pressure is now being placed on homes for the aged to provide more extended care facilities and get patients out of nursing homes and hospitals, he said. Mr. Allen said we are now getting caught in the "backwash of senior citizen housing" recently built because many of these people are now unable to care for themselves. Should more services be approved, more staff, particularly nursing staff, would have to be hired.

Baron gets 11 years

Manfred Baron, formerly of Acton, was sentenced last week to 11 years in prison for his part in the murder of a Toronto man in May, 1974. Baron pleaded guilty at a new trial, ordered by the Ontario Supreme Court. The sentence was reduced from 14 years imposed at a trial held last year. Evidence showed that Baron was involved in the disposal of the body of the husband of Rywa Wertman which was found on a farm on Highway 7. Mrs. Wertman has also been granted a new trial.
