

School costs

The actual size of educating elementary and secondary school students in Halton for 1975 compares "very favorably" with similar sized boards in Ontario, the Halton board of education learned last week.

According to a report delivered to the board by Bruce T. Lindley, superintendent of business and finance, Halton's actual cost for educating 30,600 elementary pupils was \$1,032 each. For secondary school students, numbering 19,150, the cost was \$1,625 each.

The figures are contained in a condensed report of the ministry of education which compared the costs in 18 school boards across the province ranging from Metro Toronto with 363,653 students to the smallest reported, which is the Halton separate school board with elementary students only numbering 7,791.

The separate school board's cost per pupil was \$1,017.

Halton board of education tied with Durham region, which had 29,111 elementary students, for lowest cost of business administration at \$15 per pupil. The highest cost for business administration was at the Ottawa Roman Catholic school board where it cost \$41 to administer each of 22,121 pupils in 1975.

Business administration costs per pupil for Halton's separate school board was \$28.

The Halton board's cost of business administration for secondary school students was lowest of all reported at \$24 per pupil.

The board's debt charges of \$103 per elementary student and \$119 for secondary students was high, a board spokesman told the Herald, because a lot of schools have been built in Halton lately.

The Halton separate school board's debt charges per pupil was \$113.

Providing a desk under a roof for a student to sit at was the board's greatest cost at \$70 per elementary pupil and \$1,205 for secondary students.

It cost the Halton separate school board \$66 for each of its 7,791 students to have a place to sit.
