# Raiders thrash Dunnville move into third place

The Georgetown Chrysler Raiders moved to within one point of the Port Colborne Sailors as a result of last Friday's 8-4 thrashing of the Dunnville Mudcats at the Gordon Alcott Memorial Arena.

Earlier in the OHA Intermediate "A" season, it appeared that the Mudcats, last year's league doormats, had improved and might conceivably cause problems for the league's other teams.

The impression was wrong as the Mudcats have reverted to their old ways and in fact, appear to be getting worse.

The Raiders built up a 5-0 lead before the "cats" managed to hit the scoresheet. Ed Sherwood started in nets for the Dunnville crew but after the Raiders had beaten him for two goals in the opening 20 minutes, he was pulled in favor of Rick Court, who finished the game between the pipes.

Sherwood must have considered himself very lucky indeed, as he was called upon to face only nine shots in his stint, while Court faced 31 drives in two periods of work.

Overall, the Georgetown crew outshot Dunnville, 40-23 and this was an accurate picture of the game itself.

Bob Forthingham did most of the damage for the Raiders as he netted a hatrick and opened the scoring at the 5:06 mark of the first frame. At the 16:28 mark, Forthingham put the locals in front, 2-0 and they never looked back.

By the six minute mark, of the second period, Tom Daley, Ray Evans and John Longstreet had potted markers for the Raiders and it was clear, that Dunnville was "Out to lunch."

Brian Barnett netted a counter at the 6:45 mark of the second, for Dunnville but that marked all the offense that the visitors could muster and the Raiders let, 5-1 at the end of two periods.

Dunnville got to within hailing distance when Doug Siddall scored his first of three, at the 3:42 mark of the final frame, but then the Raiders net goals from Art Webster, Evans and Forthingham to put the game

out of reach. Siddall scored his other two goals with less than four minutes remaining to be played but they were mere drops in the bucket as the issue had already been decided long before.

Graig Hooper played the full game in nets for the Raiders and while he only faced 23 shots, he did a creditable job. Ray Evans had another great night, scoring twice and adding two assists to his point total.

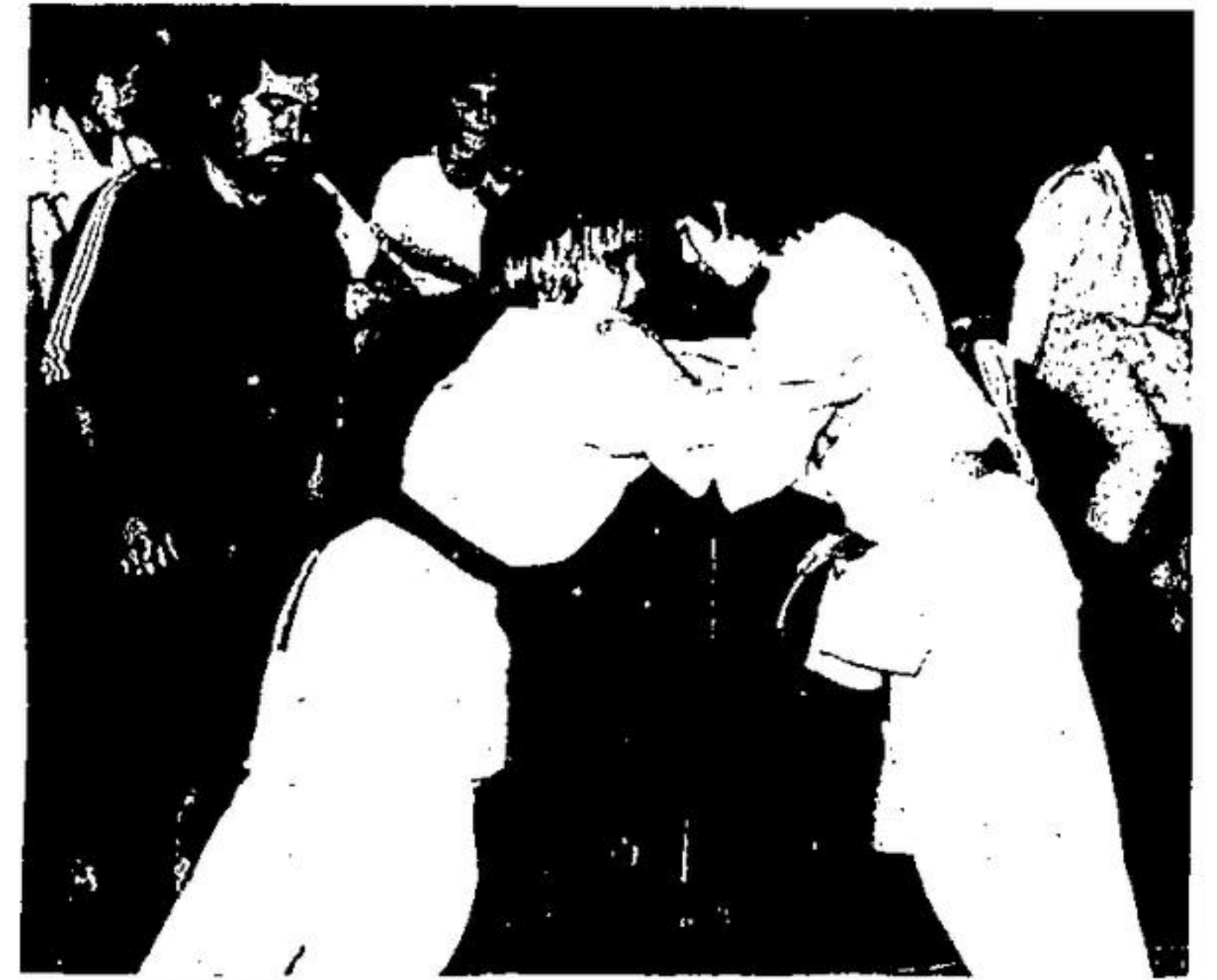
